Our present swap meet coordinator, Randy Phipps, stepped up to take on the swap meet duties because no one else out of our 1,986 members would volunteer to do the job. He relies on public transportation and has had health issues. Yet despite all that, he has been willing to do far more than younger, more energetic, healthy members of our organization.

But it's *you* who needs to gulp, take a deep shuddering nervous breath, then reach into the core of your very being to summon up the courage you need in order to step up and say, "I'll do that job."

Guests and first time attendees: Darren and Barb Tuers.

Reading, approval of minutes: Any corrections?

Motion made by Randy (Southeast Portland Chapter) to adopt January minutes as printed in the February state newsletter/paper.

Seconded by Lynn DeSpain (Salem Chapter).

Motion passed by voice vote.

Old Business

• Tabled motion from October planning session concerning on-going change to sanctioning guidelines:

State auditor: Cindy Witmer reported that she was having issues transferring from *Quicken* to *Quick Books* every month. It was suggested that everyone go to *Quick Books*, but the question of price came up. So she will research waiting until the end of the year to transfer information to *Quick Books*.

Newsletter/paper editor: Rot Path stated that there were no reports from Central Oregon, Douglas County, Jackson County, Lower Columbia, or Southeast Portland chapters.

- Even though we are doing an on-line newspaper, the deadline is still the 10th of each month.
- Rot Path wanted to remind everyone that if you do not turn in a report for three months, your chapter will not be eligible to vote.
- If any chapters are planning to do any events during *May Motorcycle Awareness* month, now is the time to get the information out there.
- In closing Rot Path asked if anyone else has noticed that governor Kitzhaber looked tired?

Legislative director: Paula Leslie stated that *BikePAC*

had narrowed their focus to five main issues and put them in a questionnaire.

- She met with Bruce Kuff and he accepted an invitation to come speak at the *May Motorcycle Awareness Rally*.
- Allan will meet with Tim Carr. Meetings with other candidates will be set up soon.
- The voter guide will be posted on-line as information comes in.
- Looking into legislation for 2014 to address the issue of motorists violating right-of-way for other motorists and not being issued a citation. (The *Milkman Mike Bill*.)
- Paula has found a lobbyist who is willing to help us with our lane sharing bill.

Sergeant-at-arms (north): Randy Phipps had nothing to report.

Sergeant-at-arms (south): Lance Tolle reports that the southern Oregon swap meet is in April.

• Southern Oregon's *May Motorcycle Awareness Rally* will be at the Josephine county courthouse, same time as last year. [Noon until 2 p.m.]

Sergeant-at-arms (east): < Vacant >

Products director: Councilman Dave Meeker was holding a raffle for a small sword. Tickets contributions are \$1 or six for \$5.

• Dave will not be able to make it to Fossil and asked for volunteers to help with the merchandise there.

State run coordinator (Fossil): Lynn DeSpain

reported that *Fossil* shirts are taken care of. No pre-orders, pay as you go, made on-site. We ordered 700 shirts and what's left over will roll over to next year.

- Band contracts are done, sound equipment contracts are done.
- Lynn has the copy of the map and flyers and will be sending them to the chapters to make copies and distribute them.
- He is also going to check on getting tickets made as no *Fossil* tickets have been printed yet.
- Lynn has asked for volunteers to haul the trash cans to *Fossil*, people to work the admission booth, emptying trash cans a couple times a day, and someone to work a barista booth (espresso).
- He has requested that all sergeant-at-arms attend and help with security.
- The city of Fossil is having a bike show and scavenger hunt. They will be held in town, as usual.
- Trophies are being made for the different events.
- It was suggested to Lynn that he change the wording from "RV sites", which suggests there will be hook ups and water to "RV parking only".

State swap meet coordinator: Randy Phipps reported that after discussions with the Troutdale site fell through and not getting any vendors to respond and commit, Randy suggested that the spring swap meet be canceled and that we focus our efforts on the fall swap

meet.

• After much discussion a motion was made by Paul (Washington County Chapter), seconded by Rick (River City Chapter) to cancel the spring swap meet.

Motion passed 8-0-1.

- Fall swap meet will be one-day event on Sunday, 12 October 2014.
- It was noted that we are making it harder on ourselves by not having a swap meet, but everyone agreed that without proper advertising and a good location, we would be setting ourselves up for failure and we are not financially strong enough for that.

Historian: Teresa Hepker < Excused > Teresa is still waiting for the records and files that were previously in the state connex to be returned to *A.B.A.T.E.* Allan has been in contact with previous officers and will get them back as soon as we can get an enclosed trailer to retrieve them. Currently looking for members that may have access to a trailer.

Web page editor: Carl Earl < Excused >

Quartermaster: Paul Hering stated that we are in possession of the canopy for the stage, but it has been in the weather since *Run–21*. The top will need to be professionally dried and cleaned. Paul said that he would be able to hang and clean the side panels at his shop though.

• The state stage is at Allan's house, but needs to be moved. If there are no chapters that

want to take possession of it, we need to decide what to do with it. There was discussion of selling it to another organization.

- Paul reminded us that we owed for 2014 rent on the Connex 48 foot trailer storage. Karen will get together with Paul on this.
- It was discussed whether or not we really need the Connex. Most of our equipment / supplies fit into the smaller enclosed trailer. Paul and Allan will look into this and report next month.

A.B.A.T.E.'s BikePAC representative: Brian Stoval < Excused >

Brian attended the *BikePAC* meeting in February, but hopes Don and Paula will have more to report on this.

• To Cindy (Lower Columbia Chapter), the BikePAC secretary has no record of receiving a check, but Brian said he will search further and report back.

M.R.F. representative: Allan Nichols reports that Washington D.C. is back in full swing again. The transportation committee is discussing the highway bill and are figuring out that we don't have the money. (lol)

- Three more states are trying to pass helmet bills. More are pursuing red light bills that would allow motorcycles to proceed when a red light fails to turn.
- CDC responded to letter sent to them asking that they concentrate on diseases and viruses while leaving the issues of motorcycle apparel to the departments that are responsible for those issues.

They more or less said "no".

- No *Beast of the East* this year because the *M.R.F.* will be going to alternate years for *Beast of the East* and *Best of the West.*
- Meeting of the Minds will continue to be held annually. This year's event will be in Kansas City, Missouri on 28 September.
- *Best of the West* will be June 6th through 8th in Frisco, Colorado. (About 45 miles west of Denver.)

Goal of the committee is to set a budget and to set priorities for the year.

Committee met at about 11:15 a.m., prior to the state board of directors meeting on 15 February 2014.

There was some discussion of ways to make money.

Laura brought up the possibility of having a chili cook-off at the swap meet. Chili cook-offs are verv popular and would bring visitors who might not usually come to a motorcycle swap meet. There could be an auction as well as donation drawings and door prizes. We could solicit prizes from motorcycle shops all over the state. This is a good idea, but feasibility would partly depend on where we hold

the swap meet and having a committee who would organize it.

We need to find out if the ads in the newspaper could be made to pay for the newspaper. Rot Path believes that the current ads we have are priced for the current market. Classified ads are offered to members for free for three months. The easiest ads for him to place in the paper are the business card size. He has more flexibility for placement.

Lynn mentioned that his chapter is working with a local scooter shop to host a poker run with them. This will help promote *A.B.A.T.E.* to the scooter riders. Other chapters should look for other riders to work with to do events. This will promote *A.B.A.T.E.* to other groups. In the long run, the results might result in more *A.B.A.T.E.* members.

Chapters could hold events at least once a year that would benefit the state treasury. Many organizations purchase a larger item (such as a gun safe) at a discounted price (or getting it donated would even be better), then have a donation drawing and make lots of money. It would be really great if a chapter would donate the item and then all the chapters could sell tickets and the drawing could be at the swap meet.

All the members need to remember that we are all members of *A.B.A.T.E.* and we need to support the state events and needs as much as we do our chapter events. This is not chapter vs state. This is about *A.B.A.T.E.* of

Oregon.

Karen will review all the expenses from last year and try to come up with a bare bones budget for next month's committee meeting discussion.

All representatives need to go back to their chapters to discuss the above ideas and figure out what might work and what won't.

We also need to get volunteers to step up to the plate and volunteer to make these things happen, not just keep talking about them.

Meeting adjourned at 11:55 a.m.

Next meeting will be at 11:15 prior to the March state board meeting.

- Randy Phipps brought up the possibility of of a fourpanel handout that would fold down to tri-fold size. Chapters could print out their own copies on plain or glossy legal-size paper. (8-1/2" x 14")
- It was suggested that we print up an advertising rate sheets for newsletter ads. It could be laminated and given to each chapter for the purpose of having more advertising in an effort to get the newspapers to pay for itself.


