# helmets: help or hindrance:

(the article below, furnished by the Rhode Island Hospital, Department of Orthopedic Surgery and Fractures was part of a report presented by Drs. A. A. Savastano and Daniel N. Kulund).

A helmet not fastened properly can lead to more problems than it prevents! one of our victims was traveling 40 mph, made a turn and skidded into a sign. He flew into the air and landed handes first, fracturing both wrists in almost identically bad fashion such that pins had to be used to fix them. He had snapped his helmet on improperly and the chin strap was loose. The helmet went off his head and tugged at his neck cutting off his breathing. Fortunately a passerby loosened it.

One of our neursurgeons has commented that he has never before seen such head trauma without evidence of external injury as in recent motorcycle accidents. At times a fractured skull is of benefit in a head injury since it permits the brain to swell. If the brain is severly concussed and swells and the skull .. does not allow for the swelling tremendous pressure can develop and the victim can DIE!

. A recent case demonstrated this problem. The boy had no external signs of head injury other than fixed dilated pupils, no reflexes and an electroencephalogram test that showed a flat line. There were no marks on his head to show that he had been injured; yet he had received the severest of brain injuries.

Though the helmet protects against abrasions and other open wounds and absorbs shocks at low speeds, at higher speeds it may actually contribute to the severity of the injury. The headgear in fact can limit visibility and worse give the operator a false sense of security on his motorcycle. -- Motorcyclist rost-

Known as "Product Linbility Insurance" more than 50-million dollars in claims are now being pursued by 30 different individuals against manufacturers, including three National belinet distributors.

and the states where these suits are filed, could also be named as liable in these lawsuits, since it was their laws that forced injured persons to wear these 'so-called' safety devices on their heads.

And that could also be the very (quiet) reason why Federal regulations were dropped and hidden inside the Federal Highway Act that President Ford signed May 5th.

This product Eablity lawsuit "business' started when a well-known National Feetball here was severely injured in a game, claiming a faulty behave.

It has also been reported that it is now impossible for helmet manufacturers to obtain any liability insurance for their products.

As long as motorcycles are ridden on the road and traus, injuries will occur, and 'mandatory holmet laws' are not going to prevent deaths where accidents happen at any speed over 10 main.

California has already proved their record (as has Illinois) that more deaths and severe injuries have been related directly to helmet wearing, and accidents have happened because the rider didn't hear, or see here use of his headgear.

It's just another argument on the right for the rider to decide for himself whether he wants or deesn't want to wear the 'headgear.'

It should be his decision, not others.



This should encourage the few of you doing most of the work. There's help on the way!






