* WEST PORTLAND CHAPTER *



Dear Gary:

In the course of my job as research assistant and librarian for the Motorcycle Safety Foundation I come across quite a few newsletters from A.S.A.T.E. organizations around the U.S. My reason for writing to your newsletter is a letter written by Stan and Dorothy Johnston about grated bridges in your June edition.

From my personal experience on these deadly bridges, and also from the updated curriculum in the Motorcycle Rider Course (MRC) offered by the Foundation, a new technique of riding across these has come about. As you well know, if you remain upright on a grated bridge you begin to get a distinct wobble from the front end. However, should you perform a slight weaving pattern across these bridges the wobble will disappear. The only point where you will incur a wobble is when you are at the point between weaves.

Should anyone be interested in learning more about this or other road hazards, please call 800-447-4700 for the rider program nearest you.

And, on a personal note (and as a member of A.3.A.T.E. of Pennsylvania), thanks for your time and space to an "out-of-stater". Ride Safe. Ride Free.

ABATE of Oregon, Inc. welcomes you to Team Oregon, a brand-new program to help make motorcycling in Oregon safer. By enrolling in the Better Biking Program you have joined a select few who have decided to increase their knowledge and skills in an approved Motorcycle Safety Foundation course. As you join the TEAM, you will be doing your part to move Oregon to the top of the league in national motorcycle safety.

The following information will help you be prepared for your class:

- 1. All students will be required to wear a long-sleeved shirt or jacket, long pants, gloves, over-the-ankle shoes or boots, and a helmet, when practicing with bikes on the driving range.
- 2. We will ride in light rain if it occurs. You may wish to bring rain gear if the weather threatens.
- 3. You will provide your own motorcycle for riding practice. A check list is provided for you to be sure your machine is in safe operating condition. Items with a star beside them are mandatory. Please bring proof of ownership and insurance for your motorcycle.
- 4. Please be advised that pre-registration tuition is non-refundable, except in emergency situations. This is necessary because class size is strictly limited for maximum individualized attention, and a minimum number of students is required to begin a new class.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

The course was developed by the Motorcycle Safety Foundation and is taught by specially trained, certified instructors. It is 8 hours long consisting of 4 hours in the classroom and 4 hours on the range. The entire course is devoted to teaching accident avoidance skills.

The classroom deals with the mental skills of riding safely in traffic. It covers everyting from basic lane placement up to handling a high-speed blow-out. On the range we teach the physical skills of accident avoidance, controlling rear wheel skids, quick stops, countersteering, turning speed selection.

Upon satisfactory completion of the course, the student is given a Team Oregon course completion card which may entitle him or her to discounts on motor-cycle insturance.

Cost of the course is \$10. Range classes are restricted to 16 students.

This Better Biking Program is funded in part by the Oregon Traffic Safety Commission, and is paid for by a portion of Oregon motorcycle license endorsement fees.

MISCELLANIA *

It's something like the rate reduction you earn for taking Driver's Ed in high school. The success of our BBP is going to depend on the number of riders who SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETE THE COURSE! It's not enough to have people sign up to take it - they have to complete it. We need to successfully train 150 people this year, or our grant for future courses may be in jeopardy! Help us out, and help yourself at the same time! It's our alternative to the helmet law, and it makes a lot more sense!






