EMERGENCY ADVISORY BOARD

OLD BUSINESS

A. Bend Chapter Suspension: Deacon sent letters to Bend's Chapter officers with little reply. So we suspended Bend's chapter charter according to our Rules of Operation.

NEW BUSINESS

A. New Mt. Hood chapter was given their charter at the meeting to Dewey (Harold D. Colen.) They started at 13 members and they now have 18.

B. Pat of N.E. Portland made a motion and passed to make a patch for the up and coming legislative year to help pay for the legislative business.

Motorcyclist dies

ASTORIA — A 21-year-old Astoria motorcyclist died early Monday, one day after driving into the rear of a parked pickup, Astoria police reported.

Larry Langdon died at 4 a.m. Monday in Portland's Emanuel Hospital & Health Center from head injuries, a spokesman for the Oregon state medical examiner's office said.

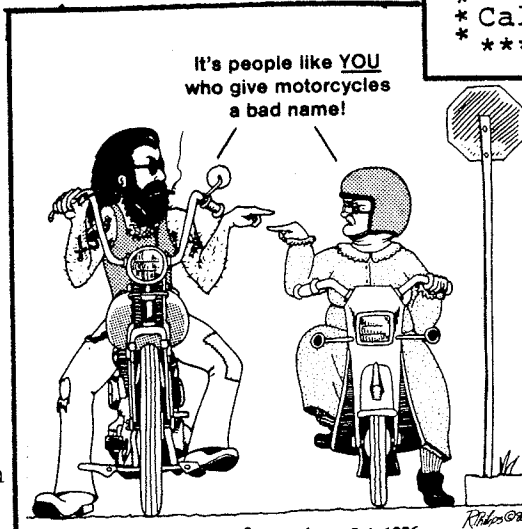
Langdon apparently was riding his cycle at a low rate of speed when he ran into the parked pickup/camper rig, said Astoria Police Commander Glenn Larson. It wasn't known when the accident took place, Larson said. Langdon was found in the street by a neighbor at 2:12 a.m.

The accident occurred about three blocks from Langdon's home, Larson said.

This appeared in the Oregonian on September 2, 1986.

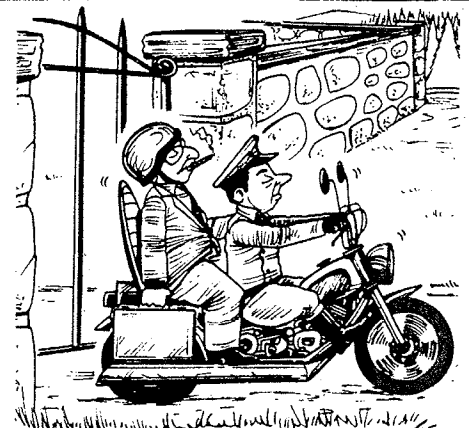
Langdon was taken to Columbia Memorial Hospital in Astoria and later airlifted to the Portland hospital, where he died.

Langdon was not wearing a helmet, Larson said.

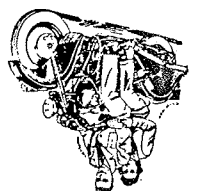

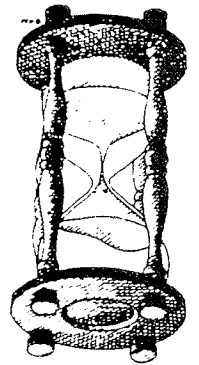
