#### STATE BOARD MEETING REPORT

The regular State Board Meeting of A.B.A.T.E. of Oregon, Inc. was held on Saturday, February 14, 1987, at Gatehouse Pizza in North Springfield. Three chapters did not have representatives at this meeting: Chapter for the Deaf, Douglas County, and Emerald Valley. These were all excused absences.

Elections were held for the positions of Sgt. at Arms #2 and Legislative Director. Terry Ritter, SE Portland is the new St. at Arms #2 and Butch, our present Lobbyist accepted the added responsibilities of Legislative Director. Congratulations to both Terry and Butch.

Patty, State Treasurer reported that we have received a \$500.00 loan repayment from the Better Biking Program, now known as Motorcycle Safety Projects and donations from SE Portland Chapter of \$500 and Lincoln County Chapter of \$232 for the Legislative Fund.

Mother, State Membership Secretary reported that we have a total of 732 members as of February 1. We gained two over last month, have 30 new members but lost 39 who did not renew. The difference is expired members who renewed.

COMMITTEE REPORTS: Finance Committee: Insurance was tabled until there is enough information for an intelligent decision. Patty is researching this. A roll call vote was taken on joining NCOM. The motion failed. A motion to increase the mileage allowance for state board officers from 20 cents a mile, one way to 21 cents a mile was passed.

Rules of Operation Committee: The April State Board Meeting will be where the Rules of Operation will be revised. If anyone has input for the revision, get them to your Chapter State Reps. A motion was made and passed that individual chapters determine whether members of the Chapter at Large may vote or make motions at that chapter until the Rules of Operation are revised.

Fossil Committee: We need a state licensed electrician now and paramedics at the run. Each Chapter State Representative at the February meeting now has Fossil tickets for sale. This is our major state fund raiser for the year and needs the support of everyone who believes in "Freedom of Choice".

Legislative Committee: Butch says GET INVOLVED! Also why are Chapter Legislative Directors calling him on Wednesdays and Thursdays? He only heard from seven chapters this past month.

A motion was passed to vote on joining NCOM at the March State Board Meeting. Your Chapter State Reps. have more information.

## Helmet bill conflict renewed

SALEM — The perennial battle over mandatory helmet use by motorcycle riders returned Thursday to the Oregon Legislature.

Rep. Mary Alice Ford, R-Portland, argued that the public was forced to assume part of the bill resulting from injuries to helmetless riders and said she would introduce a bill to require motorcycle riders to wear helmets.


Opponents were on hand, too, for Ford's news conference. About 75 vocal members of the American Motorcyclist Association and A Brotherhood Against Totalitarian Enactments, or ABATE, jammed to overflowing the small room in the Capitol used for meetings with reporters.

The motorcyclists, wearing riding outfits ranging from white windbreakers to black leather jackets and pants, said if the bill passed they would seek its repeal or a direct referral to voters.

Butch Harbaugh of ABATE said rider safety education was a better cure for accidents. Most of the fatalities cited by Ford, he said, involved riders under age 24 who had been drinking or riding at high speed. Harbaugh said the issue was individual rights, not safety.

"Operating a motorcycle is a privilege, not a right," Ford said.

While an ABATE slogan says, "Let those who ride decide," Ford countered with a slogan of her own: "Those who pay, let them have a

"We pay, too," several bikers in the back of the room said.

Asked how the law could be passed or enforced without wider support among those directly affected, Ford said, "I would hope they would change their minds."

That was greeted with laughter, so she added, "And I'm afraid I don't need their votes to pass this bill."

The 1967 Legislature made helmet use mandatory for motorcyclists, with repeal measures introduced in subsequent sessions. The 1977 Legislature approved the repeal but required helmets for riders under age 18. Several attempts have been made since to re-enact the law.

The helmet bill joins the manda-

tory seat-belt proposal and one to increase the speed limit to 65 mph under certain conditions among the traffic-safety issues facing the 1987 Legislature. Proponents of the seatbelt bill say it would save lives and money, while opponents of raising the speed limit say it would cost lives and would waste fuel.

Ford, who was joined by Sen. Rod Monroe, D-Portland, and Reps. Darlene Hooley, D-West Linn, and Judith Bauman, D-Portland, said her bill as drafted would not cover riders of scooters or mopeds.

That remark was greeted with boos. But Ford said she believed scooter riders, too, should wear helmets.




