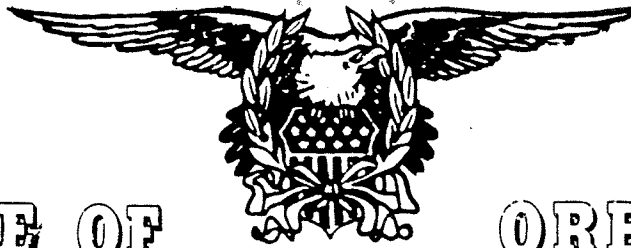

## STATE BOARD MEETING REPORT

The April State Board meeting was held on the 11th, at the Gatehouse Pizza in N. Springfield, Oregon. The meeting was called to Order at 1:01pm by Deacon. Minutes were read by Mike with one correction made. There was 25 voting reps. present & all but two State Board Officers were present.

TREASURER REPORT was given by Deacon, ask your reps. for more info. Deacon received a check from Sue Gifford of Washington Co. from the Officers of the A.M.A. Dist. 28 of \$50.00 for a small token of appreciation for taking their Legislative Officer, Sue Gifford, under our wing.

MEMBERSHIP SECRETARY Carolyn stated that as of April 1st we have 771 paid members, up 31 from last month. S.E. Portland Chapter is the largest with 114 members and Jackson Co. Chapter has 113 members.

### COMMITTEE REPORTS

FOSSIL '87: Barb; she is disappointed that there isn't enough chapters participating at Fossil, so we are going to be short on food booths at the run. If anyone member would like to have a food booth out at Fossil, please contact Barb at 289-2250. She needs all the volunteers that she can get for security.

LEGISLATIVE: Butch; the House Bill 2581 the helmet bill will be coming out of committee for action on the floor of the House. Mary Alice Ford said that she will put a referral so that will be put to a vote of the people of Oregon. Butch feels if it goes to a vote of the people, the helmet law would pass, so he is working on an alternatives to the bill. Butch would like to put a amendment to the bill to require mandatory education. The amendment would require people age 18 to 25 years of age to wear a helmet until they go through an Bikers Education Riders Course. Butch said that the P.I.P. Bill 2866 died in committee.

Motion #7. General of Mt. Hood moves, "that A.B.A.T.E. of Oregon Inc. resign from N.C.O.M. & that it be taken back to the chapters for a vote & that all chapter reps. will be bound by their chapter's vote. Seconded by Preston of Klamath Falls. Motion carries.

A Message from YOUR State Coordinator

On April 23rd, 1987 Governor Neil Goldschmidt signed a proclamation declaring MAY as "Motorcycle Safety Awareness Month". Thank's Neil !

LEGISLATIVE INFO:

Motion # 1 of the 4-11-87 State Board meeting authorized Butch's plan of A.B.A.T.E. of Oregon, backing an amendment to HB2581 creating experienced rider and non-experienced endorsements for motorcycle and moped operators.

WE (A.B.A.T.E. of Oregon, Inc.) have been preaching Educate Not Legislate Motorcycle Safety for years. The above motion gave Butch the opportunity to work with Mary Alice Ford on amending HB2581 to allow a person who has passed a Traffic Safety Commission course in Motorcycle Safety to not have to wear a helmet.

In a letter to the Governor's Office dated 4-16-87 from Mary Alice Ford, Stan Porter, Motorcycle Safety Coordinator for TEAM OREGON is quoted as saying, If they use education as a dodge from helmets, they (TEAM OREGON) lose accreditation.

She further state's to the Governor's Office that, we (Mary Alice Ford) have changed our alternative to the mandatory helmets to exclude any form of education as an alternative to mandatory helmets and will go with a "grandfather clause" only.

EXEMPTIONS from HELMENTS

# 1...If your driving record on your drivers license for 3 years shows no citations and no accidents with citation/or at fault.

And # 2...If your bike is legally licensed (current laws).

And # 3...If you have a motorcycle endorsement (current laws).

You may receive the sticker/or plate from DMV and you may go with or with out a helmet.

HELMET PENALTIES

# 1...If you don't wear a helmet and you have not qualified for the exemption, \$50 fine.

# 2...If you violate the exemption, your exemption is removed, your plate is changed to show you do not qualify for exemption and you go 3 years clean before you qualify again.

Now this sounds like BULLSHIT to me, how about you ?

On the evening of 4-28-87 Butch Harbaugh OUR State Legislative Director and Lobbyist # 1 resigned his positions. On the same evening Vicki Mott, State Lobbyist # 2 also left a message on my answering machine, that she to was resigning her position.

Thanks Butch and Vicki for all the time and effort that you have donated to A.B.A.T.E. of Oregon, Inc., to help protect OUR Freedoms at Salem.

On 4-29-87 I journeyed to Salem to touch bases with the members of the Human Resources Committee and inform them Officially that Butch and Vicki were no-longer associated with the Legislative Affairs Dept. of A.B.A.T.E. of Oregon, Inc.

They (H.R.C.) were also notified that until further notice, the Official contact between A.B.A.T.E. of Oregon, Inc. and any Legislator and/or Official in Salem will be DEACON, State Coordinator, A.B.A.T.E. of Oregon, Inc. And that until further notice, DEACON is the only person that is authorized to discuss and/or VOICE an opinion on OUR (A.B.A.T.E. of Oregon, Inc.) stand on any Legislation that's considered for action or is being acted on by the Legislators in Salem.

An appointment to talk with Mary Alice Ford face to face was made for 4-30-87.

The outcome of my meeting with her is, that her letter of 4-16-87 to the Governors Office on amendments to HB2581 still stands.

WE (you & I) the concerned motorcyclist's of Oregon need to write letters again to the members of the H.R.C. stating OUR opinion's on HB2581.

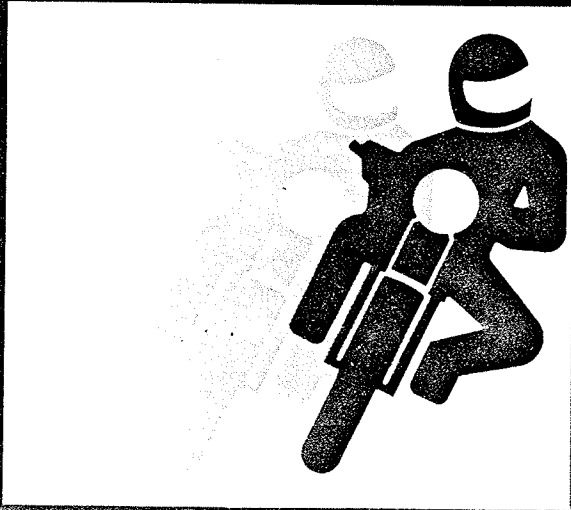

# Privacy-amendment backers go public



Oregon Right to Privacy Mural Inc. went public Wednesday in Portland's Pioneer Courthouse Square to extol the virtues of privacy and individual free choice in a not-so-private manner.

About 300 noon-hour spectators ringed the square to munch their lunches as nine speakers accused the U.S. government of intruding on private lives in areas ranging from drug testing to seat belt wearing.

Speakers included representatives of ABATE of Oregon Inc., a motorcycle group with 730 members in Oregon.

Deacon John Edwards of Cornelius, state coordinator of ABATE, which stands for A Brotherhood Against Totalitarian Enactments, said his group believed individuals should have the right to decide if they wanted to wear safety helmets and seat belts. He said laws requiring use of seat belts would be hard to enforce.

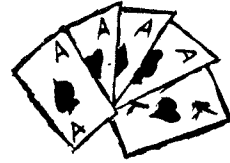
