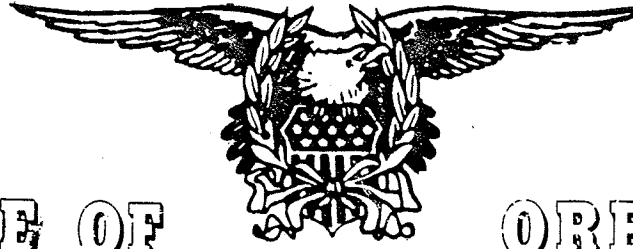

State Board Report

The August State Board meeting was held on the 8th, at the Sundown Station in Creswell, Oregon. The meeting was called to Order at 1:10pm by Deacon. There were 20 voting reps. present & all but three State Board Officers present.

Input from the Chapter for the Deaf Chapter: Deacon read a letter from them that they are turning in their chapter charter at this time due to the lack of attendance of their members. They hope sometime in the future they can start their chapter up again. We are now down to 11 chapters.

MEMBERSHIP SECRETARY: Carolyn stated that as of August 1st we have 770 paid members, down 3 from last month. N.E. Portland Chapter won the Jackson Co. Chapter membership drive with 27 new members signed up.

PARAPHERNALIA: Barb is looking into bumper stickers in helping out with our fight against the helmet bill. The cost will be between \$233.00 and \$150.00 depending on what we want to buy. Fossil pins are in now because we ran out at Fossil so if you need one contact Barb. A motion was made and passed that we change the title of Paraphernalia Director to Ways and Means because people will relate to this much better.

LEGISLATIVE DIRECTOR & LOBBYIST: Deacon; a motion was made and passed to form a steering committee to coordinate our efforts against the helmet bill. Anyone may become a member of this committee, just contact Deacon. A second motion was made and passed to hire a professional advertising agency to handle all of our media for the helmet issue. Another motion made and passed to have a information booth at the Oregon State Fair. The steering committee is handling the last two motions.

Vote of the Motion #2 from the June State Board meeting. Marv of Jackson Co. moves, to change the Rules of Operation to Article #3, Line 1, change to read each chapter to have 2 State Reps. 1-vote for each State Rep. which equals 2 votes of the 1st 50 members, plus any chapter having additional members shall have 1 extra vote for each additional 25 members on chapter rolls as of the date of the vote. Chapters must have full count of 25 additional members above original 50 to qualify for additional votes. Roll Call Vote; Douglas Co. 2 no, Jackson Co. 2 yes, K-Falls 2 no, Lane Co. 2 no, Lincoln Co. 2 no, Mt. Hood 2 no, N.E. Portland 2 no, Salem 2 yes, S.E. Portland 2 no, St. Johns 2 no & Washington Co. 1 abstention. Motion failed.

Lane County

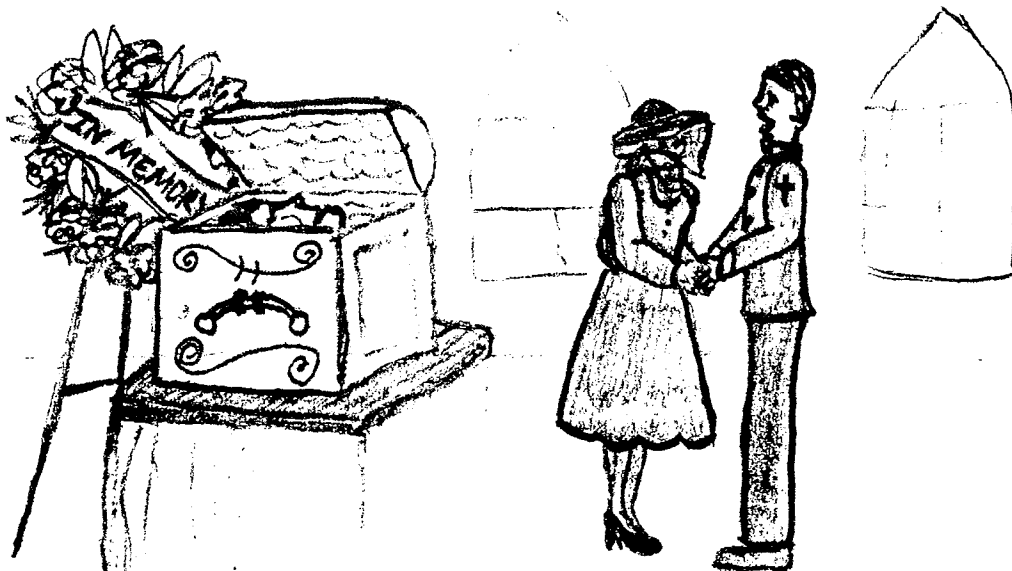

Motion #4. N.E. Portland Chapter moves, "that any motion concerning membership as a whole be voted on by a count of hands at each chapter meeting to be submitted at the State level for that motion."

Motion #6. Chris of Salem moves, "that the Rules of Operation to be amended: Article 4 State Board Officers #1, third & fourth sentences be amended to read as follows: that Board Officers and Chapter Coordinators be the Emergency Advisory Board. That the Emergency Advisory Board members be the State Coordinator, Vice Coordinators, Recording Secretary, Treasurer, Membership Secretary, Legislative Director and Chapter Coordinator from each Chapter."

S.E. Portland

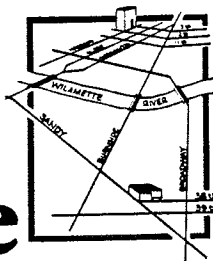
