UNITED STATES LEGISLATURE

Senator John Danforth has introduced a bill, S-1536 a Motorcycle Safety act of 1987, which would seek regulations from the Department of Transportation limiting the maximum rate of acceleration and maximum horsepower-to-weight ratios for street motorcycles.

In other words, he is trying to ban superbikes or what he refers to in the introduction to this bill as "killer motorcycles".
