If we are not worn out by then, we will turn our iron steeds west for the last leg of our quest with stops in Minneapolis, Minn. and Seattle, Wa. and on into Portland, Org.

The purpose of this trip, is to use it as a focal point for every A.B.A.T.E Member in Oregon to collect pledges and donations or goods and services which can be turned into money for your favorite charity or toy run in December 1988.




