A.B.A.T.E. is a not-for-profit organization

In Oregon, A.B.A.T.E. stands for A Brotherhood Against Totalitarian Enactments, which isn't nearly as subversive as it sounds. It means that we act as legislative watchdogs to help ensure that any legislation affecting motorcyclists is fair and that elected officials are fully informed regarding motorcycle issues.

• A.B.A.T.E. is a not-for-profit motorcycle organization devoted to raising member and public awareness about motorcycle issues and safety through education and community involvement. We also raise money for organizations that represent motorcyclist's concerns such as BikePAC.

• It doesn't matter what brand of bike you ride. We are not a manufacturer-specific organization. All are welcome: bikes, trikes, on-road or off, riders, passengers, or non-riders.

• You don't have to ride a motorcycle to belong to A.B.A.T.E. Many of our members just enjoy being around motorcyclists. (We're just that wonderful.) And they feel that the social and legislative issues we're working with are important to their community.

So scan through our newspaper. If you like what you read, check out the chapter meeting listing on the back cover. Drop in on a meeting and see what we're about. You just might find a new family in A.B.A.T.E. And as Melinda says: "Bikers give great hugs."

A Brief History of A.B.A.T.E.

"You have to know where you've been to know where you're going!"

Easyriders magazine editor Lou Kimzey issued a plea in issue #3, October 1971, for bikers to come together to fight impending restrictions from the National Highway Transportation Safety Administration (N.H.T.S.A.) by joining a new national biker's rights organization called the National Custom Cycle Association. But because of a conflict with the acronym, the name was changed in February 1972 to A Brotherhood Against Totalitarian Enactments. (A.B.A.T.E.)

Easyriders began granting state charters around 1974, and Keith Ball was the original national coordinator. The biggest threat was that the U.S. D.O.T. (Department of Transportation) was investigating ways to restrict modified or customized "choppers" which they deemed unsafe, especially extended forks.

As the rights movement grew, Don Pittsley, a member of the Huns Motorcycle Club in Connecticut convinced his congressman, representative Stewart Mckinney, to introduce HR-3869 to end the federal authority to withhold highway funds from states without helmet requirements.

In July of 1975, Rob Rasor of the American Motorcyclist Association (A.M.A.), Ron Roloff of the M.M.A. of California, and Ed Armstrong from A.B.A.T.E. of Chicago presented the house sub-committee on surface transportation with convincing testimony to repeal the helmet mandates.

Later that year, with California being sued by the D.O.T. because governor Ronald Reagan refused to comply with the federal helmet requirement mandate, Roloff helped convince California senator Alan Cranston to offer the language of the bill as an amendment to the 1975 Federal Highway Act, which passed with overwhelming support from the California delegation because of the impending lawsuit, and was signed by president Gerald Ford on May 5, 1976.

Not bad for a rag tag bunch of bikers with little or no previous political ambitions.

As a result of our newfound political clout, motorcyclists have successfully approached congress twice over the past few years.

First to grant federal protections against insurance discrimination based on mode of transportation because many companies were denying medical benefits to employees injured in motorcycle accidents.

Then, [in the 1998] session, motorcyclists united to put together a pro-active agenda for bikers, and succeeded in lobbying it through congress.

So, there you have it.

The roots of A.B.A.T.E. and biker's rights run deep in the hearts of those of us who have accepted and, in turn, passed on the torch of freedom of the road.

Each chapter needs to bring five door prizes.



National Historic Vehicle Register Act



American Motorcyclist Association

The American Motorcyclist Association supports a federal bill that would create a national register to preserve the records of historic vehicles, including motorcycles, that have made a significant impact on U.S. history and society.

The National Historic Vehicle Register Act (SB–966), introduced by U.S. senators Gary Peters (D-Michigan) and Rob Portman (R-Ohio), would require the U.S. department of the interior to establish a register housed in the library of congress to preserve examples of United States history and engineering innovation by documenting historically significant automobiles, motorcycles, trucks, and commercial vehicles.

"As a long-time motorcyclist, senator Peters knows there are few things better than the freedom of two wheels on the open road," said Wayne Allard, A.M.A. vice president for government relations. "Whether traveling cross country or just across town, motorcycles are a part of America's transportation culture."

"The American Motorcyclist Association thanks senators Peters and Portman for their leadership on this important issue, and we are pleased to support the National Historic Vehicle Register Act to help highlight America's motorcycling history," Allard said.

The *Historic Vehicle Association* has been working with the interior department on the register proposal since 2013, with the *American Motorcyclist Association* providing support.

The *Historic Vehicle Association* has documented eighteen historic vehicles through the interior department's historic american engineering record. The record recognizes a broad range of historical engineering-related sites and structures, including bridges, ships, and roads.

The national historic vehicle register act would create a stand alone register to preserve the records of historically significant vehicles that would include short narratives, photographs, and engineering drawings of each vehicle. To be eligible for the register, vehicles must be connected to a significant person or event in American history, have a unique design, or be a rare model.

The bill has been referred to the committee on energy and natural resources.

The 2017 A.M.A. motorcycle hall of fame induction ceremony will be Friday, September 22, at the *Greater Columbus Convention Center* in Columbus, Ohio. Each year, the A.M.A. motorcycle

hall of fame welcomes new members in

a ceremony that is open to the public.

In 2017, the induction ceremony is part of an exciting weekend of motorcycle activities staged in conjunction with the annual *American International Motorcycle Expo*, which brings together industry, press, dealers, and consumers in a single location.

This year, the weekend's events will be held in Columbus, Ohio, just a short drive from the A.M.A. motorcycle hall of fame in Pickerington, so fans and friends can attend the ceremony, then visit the hall of fame.

According to a report in the *Arizona Republic*, a Phoenix police motorcycle was hit by a *Tesla Model X* operating on autopilot.

Police said the officer and the *Tesla* exited a freeway with the motorcycle in front. When the rider stopped for a light, the car stopped as well, but then started moving forward. The officer jumped off the bike, which was struck at low speed by the car.

The driver reported having the car on autopilot at the time. The officer was uninjured and the car driver wasn't ticketed.

Tesla has warned customers in the past that its autopilot mode does not mean a driver can completely disengage, but increasingly it seems customers are unwilling to listen. *Tesla*'s web site specifically states that drivers are in command of their vehicles after exiting freeways.

The company announced in October that it would soon begin including hardware in its vehicles that could make them fully autonomous.

Currently, the vehicles are simply equipped with driver aids like forward collision warning, automatic braking, and auto steering.

"Didn't Care" Driver Gets 15 Years For Hitting Motorcyclist

Remember the Texas driver who was filmed deliberately swerving across centerline into a passing motorcyclist and then said "I don't care" that he'd knocked the rider and his girlfriend to the ground?

The heartless car driver is 69-yearold William Crum. Following a two-day trial at 355th district court in Hood County, Texas, he's been sentenced to fifteen years in prison after being convicted on one count of aggravated assault with a deadly weapon and aggravated assault with a deadly weapon causing bodily injury.

The fifteen-year sentence means that Crum, who was arrested soon after the incident in Granbury, Texas in October 2015, will be in prison until he's 84.

S.P.Y. Car Study Act

With motorcyclists sharing the road with a growing number of, smart vehicles, security from cyberintrusion is a significant safety concern.

U.S. representatives Joe Wilson (R-SC) and Ted Lieu (D-CA) have introduced HR–701, the *Security and Privacy in Your Car Study Act of 2017 (S.P.Y. Car Study Act)* to address automotive software safety, cyber security, and privacy regulations.

This bill would require the *National Highway Traffic Safety Administration* to conduct a study to determine and recommend standards for the regulation of the cyber security of motor vehicles manufactured or imported for sale in the United States. The study shall identify:

• Isolation measures that are necessary to separate critical software systems that can affect the driver's control of the movement of the vehicle from other software systems.

• Measures that are necessary to detect and prevent or minimize

anomalous codes in vehicle software systems associated with malicious behavior.

• Techniques that are necessary to detect and prevent, discourage, or mitigate intrusions into vehicle software systems and other cyber security risks in motor vehicles.

• Best practices to secure driving data about a vehicle's status or about the owner, lessee, driver, or passenger of a vehicle that is collected by the electronic systems of motor vehicles.

• A timeline for implementing systems and software that reflect such measures, techniques, and best practices.

Autocycles No Longer Considered Motorcycles In Two More States

Colorado and Wyoming are the latest states to reclassify their licensing requirements which allow drivers of so-called "autocycles", such as the *Polaris Slingshot*, to operate the vehicle with a valid state driver's license instead of requiring a motorcycle endorsement or license. Drivers under the age of 18 will still be required to wear a helmet, in accordance with the states' motorcycle helmet regulations.

Because of the three-wheeled configuration and characteristics of autocycles, determining how to classify them has been a challenge for state governments. *Polaris* calls the *Slingshot* a "three-wheeled motoroadster." Initially, when it was introduced to the market in 2014, consumers were required to have a motorcycle endorsement or license to

operate the *Slingshot*, which offers a distinct ride through its open cockpit and side-by-side seating.

Currently, thirty states, including the District of Columbia, require only a driver's license to drive an autocycle. The remaining states require a motorcycle endorsement, but *Polaris* says efforts are being made to reclassify the vehicle to gain full conformity throughout the United States.

"As we educate state officials on the unique attributes of this categorycreating Slingshot, they are realizing that the licensing requirement for the roadster are more similar to that of a driver's license than of a motorcycle endorsement or license," said Rachael Elia, Slingshot marketing manager. "Our goal is to gain a unified classification across the country to provide more opportunity and driving freedom for consumers looking for the ultimate thrill experience."

Harley Pulled Into Political Fight Over Leather Products

Many challenges face motorcycle manufacturers selling their products in other countries.

A strange example of this is *Harley-Davidson* facing a public relations issue in India over leather, something as closely associated with bikers as the bikes they ride.

Leather comes from cows, which are revered and even worshiped by many in the Hindu community. According to the *Hindustan Times*,

Popular actor and producer Ajaz Khan is urging India's prime minister to impose a ban on *Harley-Davidson* products, claiming they're made from cow hide. "*I just bought a leather belt from* Harley Davidson," Khan is quoted by the *Hindustan Times* as saying. "*This is a cow leather belt. It's being sold in the entire world. If you really consider yourself men, then I request [the prime minister] shuts down* Harley Davidson." (continued from previous page)

Motorcycle Awareness Rally Put On Hold After London Terror Attack

A mass London Awareness Ride-Out to be held a day after a deadly terrorist attack in the vicinity of the palace of Westminster, seat of the British Parliament, had to be rescheduled in the wake of the Wednesday, March 22 car attack that killed four and injured more than fifty pedestrians.

The campaign group *We Ride London*, which aims to be the "main lobby group for riders of motorcycles, scooters and mopeds in London," had invited thousands to join a ride at 1 p.m. on Thursday, April 23, from Regents park through central London to city hall, but had to call the event off.

A statement on the group's Facebook page said: "We have decided to cancel tomorrow's awareness ride in light of the terrible events in our capital today. Now is not the time to be hindering the emergency and security services as they investigate and recover from this."

IT IS HEREBY ADJUDGED AND DECLARED that Oregon House Bill 3422 means that as long as a motorcycle rider is wearing a protective covering on his head that has a hard outer shell, padding adjacent to and inside the outer shell and a chin-strap retention system with a sticker indicating that the motorcycle helmet meets standards established by the United States Department of Transportation the rider is in compliance with state law with respect to his helmet and a police officer may not inquire further to determine if the helmet worn meets United States Department of Transportation testing standards.


