What We're About

A.B.A.T.E. is a not-forprofit organization

In Oregon, A.B.A.T.E. stands for A Brotherhood Against Totalitarian Enactments, which isn't nearly as subversive as it sounds. It means that we act as legislative watchdogs to help ensure that any legislation affecting motorcyclists is fair and that elected officials are fully informed regarding motorcycle issues.

- A.B.A.T.E. is a not-for-profit motorcycle organization devoted to raising member and public awareness about motorcycle issues and safety through education and community involvement. We also raise money for organizations that represent motorcyclist's concerns such as BikePAC.
- It doesn't matter what brand of bike you ride. We are not a manufacturer-specific organization. All are welcome: bikes, trikes, onroad or off, riders, passengers, or non-riders.
- You don't have to ride a motorcycle to belong to A.B.A.T.E. Many of our members just enjoy being around motorcyclists. (We're just that wonderful.) And they feel that the social and legislative issues we're working with are important to their community.

So scan through our newsmagazine. If you like what you read, check out the chapter meeting listing on the back cover. Drop in on a meeting and see what we're about. You just might find a new family in *A.B.A.T.E.* And as Melinda says: "Bikers give great hugs."

A Brief History of A.B.A.T.E.

"You have to know where you've been to know where you're going!"

Easyriders magazine editor Lou Kimzey issued a plea in issue #3, October 1971, for bikers to come together to fight impending restrictions from the National Highway Transportation Safety Administration (N.H.T.S.A.) by joining a new national biker's rights organization called the National Custom Cycle Association. But because of a conflict with the acronym the name was changed in February 1972 to A Brotherhood Against Totalitarian Enactments (A.B.A.T.E.).

Easyriders began granting state charters around 1974, and Keith Ball was the original national coordinator. The biggest threat was that the U.S. D.O.T. (Department of Transportation) was investigating ways to restrict modified or customized "choppers" which they deemed unsafe, especially extended forks.

As the rights movement grew, Don Pittsley, a member of the *Huns Motorcycle Club* in Connecticut convinced his congressman, representative Stewart Mckinney, to introduce H.R.3869 to end the federal authority to withhold highway funds from states without helmet laws.

In July of 1975, Rob Rasor of the American Motorcyclist Association (A.M.A.),

Ron Roloff of the M.M.A. of California and Ed Armstrong of A.B.A.T.E. of Chicago presented the house sub-committee on surface transportation with convincing testimony to repeal the helmet mandates.

Later that year, with California being sued by the *D.O.T.* because governor Ronald Reagan refused to comply with the federal helmet law mandate, Roloff helped convince California senator Alan Cranston to offer the language of the bill as an amendment to the 1975 Federal Highway Act, which passed with overwhelming support from the California delegation because of the impending lawsuit, and was signed by president Gerald Ford on May 5, 1976.

Not bad for a rag tag bunch of bikers with little or no previous political ambitions.

As a result of our newfound political clout, motorcyclists have successfully approached congress twice over the past few years, first to grant federal protections against insurance discrimination based on mode of transportation because many companies were denying medical benefits to employees injured in motorcycle accidents.

Then, [in the 1998] session, motorcyclists united to put together a pro-active agenda

for bikers, and succeeded in lobbying it through congress.

So, there you have it.

The roots of *A.B.A.T.E.* and biker's rights run deep in the hearts of those of us who have accepted and, in turn, passed on the torch of freedom of the road.



Well, with the sun peaking out these days our riding season is underway at Hub City Chapter.

This also means that our legislative and community efforts are renewed as well an already the chapter has begun to come alive with renewed enthusiasm for our

On the legislative front, the modification to vulnerable road users act passed overwhelmingly the house this week, much in part due to the efforts of our Albany state representative, Andy Olson.

Andy visited Hub City during the reelection cycle last fall and listened

intently to our concerns for motorcycle rights and safety. One of his promises to us was that he would take a look at the omission of motorcycle riders from last year's vulnerable road users bill that became state regulation. And he came through with flying colors. Upon reelection, Andy immediately reopened the issue in Salem and co-sponsored a modification to add motorcycle riders to the regulation. All appears to be on track at this time to pass both chambers in Salem and I am very proud of the legislative work that Hub City Chapter did late in the year to communicate this issue to Andy and their involvement in

his reelection. This was a prime example of how A.B.A.T.E. and BikePAC are supposed to function and appears to only be the first of several "wins" that motorcycle riders in Oregon will gain this session through all of our efforts.

Our "community involvement" work began again this month through our highway cleanup crew. Thanks to all members who took a few hours out of their Saturday to renew our commitment to the local community and keep our section of local highway 34 identified as sponsored by Hub City Chapter.

We are gearing up now for the May Awareness Rally as our next group ride and "show of force" for BikePAC and A.B.A.T.E. in Salem on May 2nd. We will be riding as a group (hopefully pulling in several other riding groups from the Albany area) to Salem again this year. We had a great showing from this chapter last year at this event and we expect an even better turnout in 2009.

Our first chapter-sanctioned event will be our 8th Annual Poker Run on June 6th. It starts out at Humpty's Dump in Albany with the last bike out by 11 a.m. This run typically brings in several hundred bikes from around the valley and even many riders from the Portland and Eugene areas. Route instructions will be made available at check-in and you can expect lots of door prizes and a great route from Hub City Chapter, as always. We hope to see you all there on June 6th!

Finally we would like to remind all riders to review their insurance coverage with their agents to ensure that you and your passengers are well-tended for this riding season. With the new regulations here requiring a birth certificate to be shown when you get a driver's license, our local insurance contacts have reported a dramatic reduction in insurance renewals. This means an increase in uninsured motorists out there and you need to ensure that your uninsured motorist clause is more than adequate to make up for this.

11 April 2009 - Eagles' Lodge; Albany, Oregon

Meeting was called to order by Gene Mortimore (vice-coordinator-east) at 12:15 p.m. with 12 of 13 chapters represented. All chapters present were eligible to vote. Absent chapters: *Douglas County*.

Pledge of allegiance.

Moment of silence for downed brothers/sisters and service men/women.

Guests and first time attendees: Karen (*Josephine County*), Ian Aylward (*Lincoln County*).

Motion made by Brian Stovall, River City Chapter, to accept minutes from March 14th State Board meeting as printed in the Newsmagazine; Randy Phipps, Twin Rivers Chapter, seconded the motion. Motion passed

Coordinator comments: Gene Mortimore (vice coordinator-east). This is going to be a fast meeting. Jordan had a death in the family and is unable to attend. Ted Tracy who was going to run this meeting had to attend to a family emergency at the last minute. His son contracted appendicitis. May have to leave meeting early, if we don't get done. Have a time constraint to meet.

Secretary report and correspondence: Nic reported that he has just received the mail and as soon as it is logged in, it will be distributed appropriately.

Spoke on an e-mail received by the coordinator regarding a link provided by the *Motorcycle Superstore* direct to *A.B.A. T.E. of Oregon*'s web site. This link was provided free of charge and is the first one on their "Links" list. They asked if we would give them a link to their site from our web page. This was discussed and Trace (state web master) said that this is common practice and no liability on our side and at no cost. It was decided to have Trace make the link.

Nic then spoke on an e-mail he had received from Matt Price and Rot Path regarding a t-shirt design that looks like the P.O.W./M.I.A. design. 

GUNNY'S SACK

Here in the pacific northwest we are finally getting some of the nicest weather we've had in months after a tough winter. Riders are starting to appear on the roadways. Take the time to go over your scooter to make sure it's roadworthy. Too many times folks just go out and climb on that ride when the sun comes out without regard to the fact it's sat in the garage all winter gathering dust. Check the tires, change the oil, look at the machine and tighten anything that might fall off and cause you trouble. This will help you live up to my tagline, "Keep the round side on the bottom".

I hate going to hospitals and funerals just because a brother or sister didn't take care of that ride. Use a little caution on the road until you put a mile or two under yur butt too and get your sea legs back. Remember that scoot has been sitting still for a month or two and so have you. Loosen up slowly and remind yourself of the things ya learned in that riding course ya took last fall. Wouldn't hurt to take another one just for the fun of it.

Riding Keeps You Young

Tokyo: Riding motorcycles helps keep riders young by invigorating their brains, the scientist behind popular "brain training" computer software said, citing a new scientific study.

"The driver's brain gets activated by riding motorbikes," in part because it requires heightened alertness, Ryuta Kawashima said. Middle-aged men were the target of this experiment. Makes sense to this old guy.

Missouri: If you're twenty-one or older ya might get the chance to ride lidless here. Folks in the know here think this bill has the bones to make it to the governor's desk. This bill sure has my support, for what it worth. Freedom on the road is what riding is all about.

Australia: All the new regulations and rules against motorcycle clubs in this country are having the effect of uniting some of the Australian clubs. More and more are working together in an effort to curb the anti-motorcyclist legislation there. Information coming to us is they are only a few steps away from forming their own political party. I'm excited to see what that brings about. That sort of unity among bikers could and should spread around the world. Shakes the system up when we play by the rules they themselves put into practice. Go for it, Aussies. With certainly my blessing.

Virginia: One of our A.I.M. attorneys, Tom McGrath, is gonna have some fun with the new city regulation in Staunton that says ya gotta wear a helmet in this town. They're gettin' pretty petty when town by town ya gotta stop and figure out whether to put on a lid. Waynesboro and Augusta county already have individual helmet requirements and motorcyclists are up in arms over it.

Seems to me if the state doesn't have such legislation, the parts of the state shouldn't either.

We'll see what Tom comes up with and keep ya posted.

What A Real Turkey

Buckfield, Maine: Police said a wild turkey is to blame for knocking a 23year-old man off his motorcycle and breaking his collarbone.

Maine state trooper Corey Huckins said Jeffrey Russell of Hartford was riding with a friend on route 117 in Buckfield on a Sunday afternoon when a wild turkey flew straight into his chest, knocking him backward off his motorcycle. Huckins said the impact was like "hitting a bowling ball at 45 m.p.h." The impact killed the turkey.

Too bad it wasn't thanksgiving. He would have gotten revenge.

Beers To You

Amsterdam, New York: The woman accused of causing a fatal motorcycle crash in Amsterdam has been indicted on reckless endangerment charges, according to an Associated Press story. The woman allegedly threw a beer can at David Rivera back in April of last year, causing him to lose control of his bike and crash into another vehicle. Cops say the biker's speed was a factor but the beer can distracted Rivera and contributed to the crash.

Seems to me if you throw a beer can at a moving motorcyclist and he dies, it's murder, not just reckless.

Blue Plate Special

Seattle, Washington: A motorcycle rights group is demanding answers from the Washington state patrol. During an annual rally at the capitol this year, a state trooper was seen on video as he recorded the license plate numbers of those attending. The sergeant was seen wandering through the parking lot and using a voice recorder to take down the license plate numbers from motorcycles. At one point he even backs into the bushes to get a better look at the tags.

A.I.M. attorney Marty Fox is spearheading an inquiry into the

"Seeing an officer from the state patrol in the bushes, doing this is just shocking," said Marty Fox, an attorney for the motorcycle rights group A.B.A.T.E. of Washington. A.B.A.T.E. members were inside the capitol building for an annual biker day at the state capitol, meeting with their legislators about legislation affecting motorcyclists, when the trooper recorded the license plate numbers. This smells to high heaven to me. Blatant profiling borders on criminal activity to

Gunny says the capitol belongs to every citizen, and motorcycle club members are citizens too.

Cops say they aren't keeping the numbers on file.

Yeah and pigs fly with passengers.

A.B.A.T.E. is still waiting to get that in writing.

The trooper involved is currently on vacation in Mexico and the state patrol has been unable to reach him for details on what he was doing.







Consumer Product Safety Commission Poised To Vote On Excluding Youth O.H.V.s From Lead Law

The federal *Consumer Product Safety Commission* is set to vote soon on whether to grant an exemption for youth-model motorcycles and A.T.V.s to a new lead law that currently prohibits them from being offered for sale.

The legislation is the *Consumer Product Safety Improvement Act* (*C.P.S.I.A.*), which went into effect in February. It was meant to protect children 12 and under from toys containing lead. But the regulation also covers youth-model motorcycles and A.T.V.s, meaning they can't be sold unless they are granted an exclusion from the regulation.

Under the *C.P.S.I.A.*, all youth products containing lead must have less than 600 parts per million by weight. The *C.P.S.C.* has interpreted the law to apply to various components of youth-sized off-highway vehicles (O.H.V.) including the engine, brakes, suspension, battery, and other mechanical parts. Even though the lead levels in these parts are small, they are still above the minimum threshold.

Acting *C.P.S.C.* chairman Nancy Nord has already indicated she will vote against granting an exemption, but will support a one-year moratorium on enforcing the lead regulation to give congress an opportunity to change the legislation. The only other commissioner on the panel, Thomas Moore, hasn't indicated how he will vote.

Meanwhile, U.S. senate and house members have written letters to Nord and Moore urging them to grant the exclusion from the regulation for youth-model motorcycles and A.T.V.s that is being sought by the industry and others.

"While the act was passed with laudable intent, it has created a well-documented safety hazard for children, a severe and unwarranted disruption to families who recreate together, and a deleterious effect on youth amateur racing," said the U.S.

senate letter

"Additionally, the inclusion of O.H.V.s has created an economic disaster for an industry which is already reeling from the recession, is facing countless layoffs and is estimated to be losing \$3 million per day due to the act," the letter said.

The U.S. house letter noted that house members are particularly concerned with the unintended safety consequences of the lead legislation.

"As you may know, the O.H.V. community and the *C.P.S.C.* have worked extensively together to develop appropriate O.H.V. size and operating guidelines for young riders," the house letter said. "To suddenly eliminate the availability of all youth O.H.V.s is counterproductive to all the work that the O.H.V. community and the *C.P.S. C.* have done to promote youth rider safety.

HR-1253 Passes United States House of Representatives

The *Motorcycle Riders* Foundation reports that the U.S. house passed HR–1253, sponsored by Michael C. Burgess (R-TX) and cosponsored by Bart Stupak (D-MI), which would require that people signing up for a health plan receive in writing an explanation of treatment limits or non-covered conditions, along with other plan restrictions, "in a form that is easily understandable." The bill passed with overwhelming support with the final vote coming in at 422-3.

All group health plans would be covered by the bill and health plans would be required to provide the information before customers sign up.

"We are going to stand up and shine a light on these exclusions so Americans will not be caught offguard by exclusions buried deep within an insurance plan," said Burgess, a physician.

HR–1253 at this point does not have a senate companion bill which is the next step before this legislation is signed into statute.

"This legislative action keeps congress on record that this issue needs their attention," said Jeff Hennie, M.R.F. vice president of government relations. "While this bill is a step in the right direction, the M.R.F. remains committed to securing coverage of any injury that comes from legal use of an on-road motorcycle."

Motorcycle Safety Resolution

The United States house of representatives' committee on transportation and infrastructure passed house resolution 269, a bill entitled Supporting The Goals Of A Motorcycle Safety Month. The bill is sponsored by Gabrielle Giffords (D-AZ) who is both co-chair of the US house motorcycle safety caucus and an avid rider. Representative Giffords is joined by her fellow co-chair of the motorcycle safety caucus, Michael Burgess (R-TX), as an original cosponsor.

The bill puts the congress on record as recognizing the contribution motorcycles make to the transportation mix. It encourages all road users to be more aware of motorcycles and motorcyclists' safety.



This is in addition to encouraging all riders to receive appropriate training and practice safe riding skills and supporting the goals of a *Motorcycle Safety Awareness Month*.

The bill was passed unanimously by the committee with many positive statements from committee members. Transportation and infrastructure chairman James Oberstar (D-MN) cited many positive aspects of motorcycling and was complementary to his constituents who have been in touch with him concerning motorcycle awareness programs. The bill will next head to the house floor for a full vote.

The Motorcycle Riders Foundation encourages its members to contact their individual member of congress to sign on as cosponsors of this legislation.


