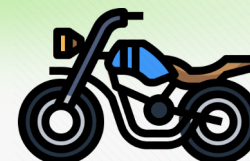

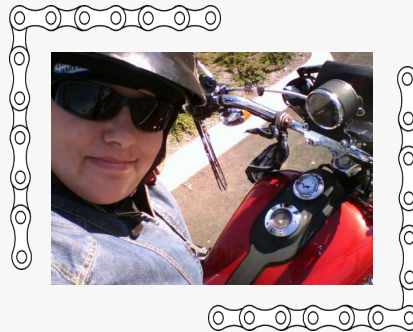

State Coordinator

I am happy to announce that David Ganslein has been working hard for all of us. He has been busy representing Abate of Oregon, and Bike/Pac of Oregon. David has successfully secured us a spot across from the Capital building in Salem for our May awareness rally in 2022. I have heard some talk around the water cooler about some chapters maybe putting on a poker run after the event.

Hub City Abate Chapter is starting off this year's events with the Chilly buns run this month.

I am looking forward to making it to at least one event from every chapter this year. I tried my hardest last year. I know I missed a couple of Chapter runs.

I have been aware of a couple more accidents that have happened in group rides. No they were not chapter rides thank goodness. One of the groups were from the Salem area. I was sent the video of two of the accidents that happened

.After reviewing the videos I came to the conclusion that both crashes could have been avoided. One of the riders were riding way to fast to negotiate a lefthand turn on winter road conditions. He was trying to pass the group of bikes to get up front after he road guarded. I believe he slipped on some de-icer that was put on the road.

The other accident that I watched showed a group of bikes following to close too the back of a vehicle. When the vehicle slowed down to make a turn. The bikes behind the vehicle had to come to a fast slow down. Once they started to make the fast slow down the bikes behind them had no room to slow down safely and locked up their rear wheels. Four of the bikes went down. Again it was on a wet road that had tar snakes, and de-icer on it. The temperature out side was 49 degrees.

With all that being said. I believe that crash could

have been avoided also. By the lead bikes not following the vehicle so close. Then by the rest of the riders behind them not following so close to the bike in front of them. It was obvious that they were fixated on the bike right in front of them. If they would have been watching the bikes further down the road they might have been able to slow down in time.

Also if they would have taken a breaking clinic through an advanced riders training program.

With all that said, road conditions, and speed were the main factors for both of those accidents.

We are all responsible for our own rides. If you are riding in a group the leader is responsible for the group. He or she sets the speed for the group. If they see, or hear of someone riding like an idiot in the group, or drinking to much during the ride it should be addressed.

We all are responsible to ride our own ride, but when your in a group ride you need to be aware of the riders around you. Remember riding in a group is the most dangerous conditions you will ever ride in.

At the end of the day we all want to go home to our families. I will step off my soap-box now. I am happy to report that no one was killed in any of the group accidents I have heard of.

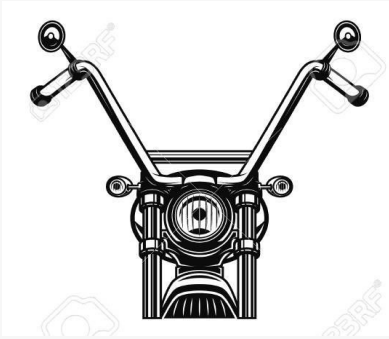

Hope to see everyone on the Chilly Buns ride.



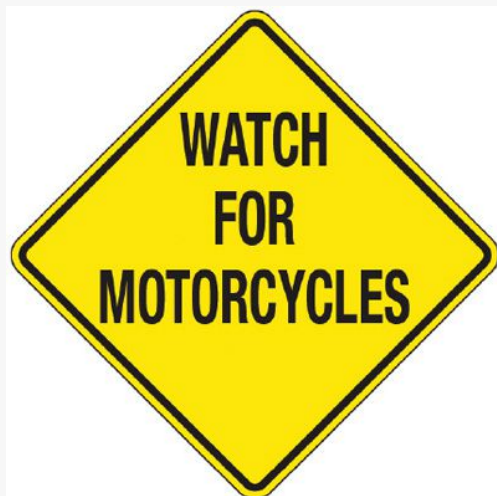

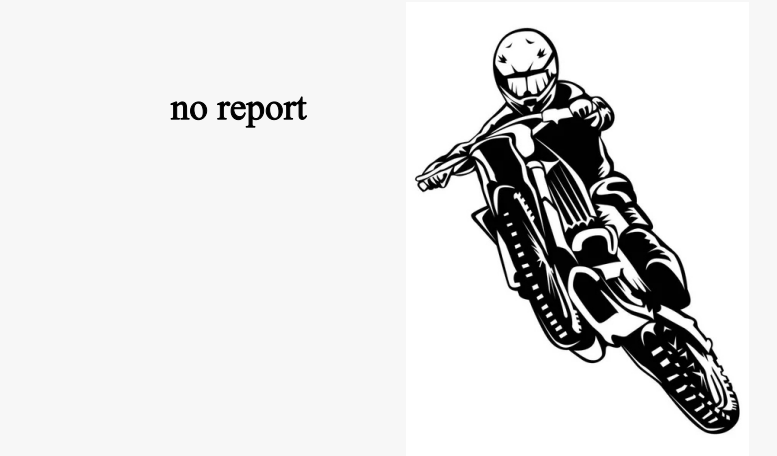

executive board meetings in November and December.

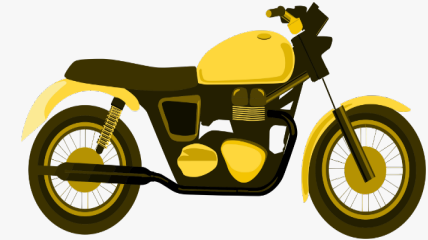

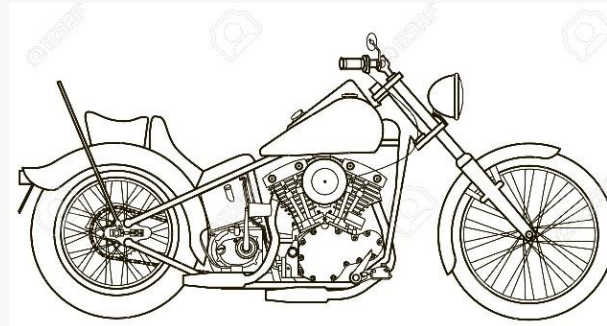
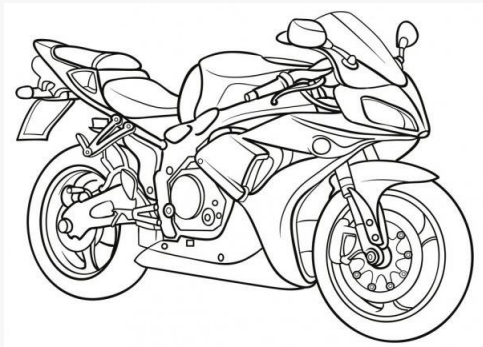

priming for success

A big warm A.B.A.T.E. welcome to our amazing new editor for the state newspaper, Theresa "T" Velazquez, a.n.e.

Please give her and all other fresh officers at chapter and state levels your help and cooperation so they can do the best job possible for all of us.

"T" is very busy supporting Oregon A.B.A.T.E.'s mission at so many levels that the term "amazing" barely seems adequate. In addition, she works full time+, so helping her transition into the editor gig is one of the best valentines you can send her way.

This month is our state's 163rd birthday. On 14 February 1859, Oregon became the thirty-third state of the union. Traditionally, cake has been available in the capitol every year. If you happen to be in Salem on the second Monday, you might consider dropping by our marble-clad political corral to scarf cake and maybe rub elbows with our elected officials. (Subject to any covid-19 restrictions that might be in place at the time.) With any luck, you might be able to introduce your fine self to your own representative or senator and ask them to support any legislation that BikePAC puts forth.

Speaking (or rather writing) about BikePAC, Oregon A.B.A.T.E.'s motorcyclist political action committee could use more members actively participating in efforts to safeguard motorcyclists' rights and safety.

(That would be you.)

Becoming involved with BikePAC is living the ideals that founded our republic.

It's time to begin laying out the groundwork for next year's full legislative session. To be successful, we need to start now, educating and gathering legislative supporters among elected and appointed officials.

And we may need to change some of our tactics by taking a longer view.

Some folks are suggesting that modifying existing legislation is more achievable than introducing new bills.

We tried that in 2005 with HB-2488, but it died in committee. (Apparently for lack of motorcyclist testimony.)

Let's try it again, but with greater concession at the outset to address legislators' concerns:

Riders over 21 with additional medical insurance and a license plate sticker could ride without helmets.

That would cover arguments about increased medical care costs and police enforcement. (After a few years of successful lidless riding, those concessions might be modified or eliminated by legislative modifications.)

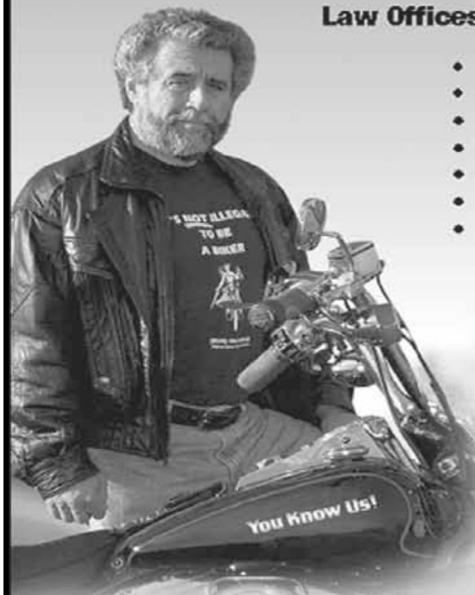

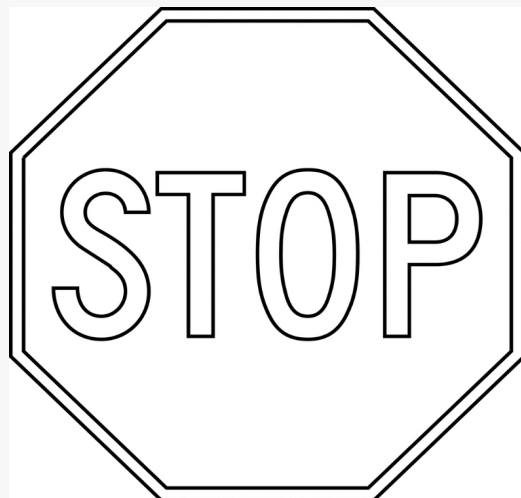
