What is A.B.A.T.E.? We are a State Motorcycle Rights Organization (S.M.R.O.) dedicated to educating riders, drivers, and elected officials about issues affecting motorcyclists. We help fund a political action committee (BikePAC) that directly interacts with the legislature about motorcycles issues and bills that affect us.

What does "A.B.A.T.E."mean? A.B.A.T.E. Stands for A **Brotherhood Against Totalitarian** Enactments. The organization was formed when legislators passed bills adversely affecting riders without consulting them. We also do business as A Brotherhood Aimed Towards Education.

Mission Statement: A.B.A.T.E. of Oregon, Inc. Promotes motorcycle awareness, education, safety, and liberty through community involvement and legislative action.

What is BikePAC? Founded in 1988, BikePAC members track legislation, brief officials, and report to A.B.A.T.E. about issues affecting motorcyclists.




lucky that we do not have to fight as hard as other states for our rights.



As we march into the third month of the year, one question we can be asking ourselves while looking at life is, "How could motorcycles make it better?"

Back when this century was stumbling to its feet, at one of our S.T.E.A.M. (Seminars To Educate And Motivate) events a British motorcyclist, Simon Milward, shared his vision of how motorcycles could be used for more than pleasure. He was riding around the world, advocating for using motorcycles to make basic health care accessible to everyone, especially in rural areas.

Closer to home, yer crusty ol' former editor (c.o.f.e.) rediscovered model rocketry later in life, riding his bike to a couple of public launch days.

It was autumn and they were using a farmer's large field that had been harvested for their launch site.

One thing about model rockets is that the higher they go, the less likely they are to land anywhere close to the launch pad.





Election of Executive Director, Treasurer, and Membership Director shall take place in even numbered years. Election of Secretary and Legislative director shall take place in odd numbered years. Paula's Legislative Report - She is tracking three bills that could affect motorcycle riders: SB 1510, SB 1508, and HB 4105. Paula will be sending out the details on these bills.

GAC meeting is scheduled to be held virtually on February 10th at 4:00pm. Instructions on joining the meeting can be found on the ODOT/ Governor's Advisory Committee on Motorcycle website. This is a TEAMS meeting, and instructions are also on this website. Doug and Paula are planning to attend.

Fun Motorcycle Facts

- On average, motorcycles are about twice as fuel efficient as cars.
- Insurance statistics show that in inner cities, one in five motorcycles are stolen. Honda is the most common brand stolen and Harley is the least.
- The famous 65-foot jump over a barbed wire fence in the movie The Great Escape was not performed by Steve McQueen, but by motorcycle stuntman Bud Ekins, who did it in one take.
- The German inventor Gottlieb Daimler is generally credited with building the first practical motorcycle in 1885.
- The first Harley Davidson motorcycle, built in 1903, used a tomato soup can for a carburetor.
- Evel Knievel holds the world record for breaking the most number of bones and surviving. His real name was Robert Craig Knievel and during his stunt career, he spent a total of three years in the hospital.
- Early bike helmets were lined with cork.
- The first rider to ever go over 300 mph was Don Vesco in 1975, on a 1496cc Yamahaengined streamliner.
- The Dodge Tomahawk is considered the fastest motorcycle in the world to date. It uses a 10-cylinder, 90 degree v-type engine and can reach up to 350 mph.
- Front tires disperse water at three times the rate of rear tires.
- Kawasaki was solely involved in aerospace development and only created the Kawasaki motorcycle to aid in marketing and publicizing their "heavy industries" which was unknown by the public.
- When rounding corners, 75% of a bike's grip comes from the front tire.
- In 1999, Harley Davidson tried unsuccessfully to trademark the name "hog," which was originally coined from a group of 1920s farmers known as hog boys because they had a live pig as a mascot.
- BMW is the only current major manufacturer to reject the use of telescopic forks on its big bikes. Yet BMW was the first to use and patent them, on the R12 in 1935.

Motorcycle Laws in Oregon

Have a valid motorcycle-endorsed driver license or have a valid motorcycle instruction permit.

Wear a motorcycle helmet that is DOT-compliant.

Register their motorcycle and display a valid license plate.

Have liability insurance (25/50/20).

Carry their endorsed driver license or motorcycle instruction permit and driver license, vehicle registration card and current proof of insurance when riding. Motorcycle operators riding on a motorcycle instruction permit must also:

Be supervised by an endorsed rider 21 or older operating a separate materials

Ride only during daylight hours.

Not carry passengers.

The penalty for riding without a motorcycle endorsement can be as much as \$720 plus court costs – double that in a school or work zone. Learn about how to earn a motorcycle endorsement in Oregon.

Motorcycle Equipment

To be street legal, a motorcycle or moped must have:

A white headlight, illuminated at all times. Motorcycles must have at least one, but not more than three, white headlights. Modulating headlights are allowed during daylight hours.

At least one red taillight with a red stop lamp.

At least one red reflector on the rear, one white license plate light, one rearview mirror and a horn.

Turn signal lights. Motorcycles built before 1973 are not required to have turn signal lights, however, vehicles without turn signal lights may not be operated after dark.

Fenders on all wheels.

At least one brake operated by hand or foot.

An exhaust system in good working order and in constant operation. The exhaust must prevent the discharge of any visible emissions and keep noise levels at or below standards set by the Department of Environmental Quality. A valid license plate mounted to be easily read and plainly visible from the rear. Motorcycle Laws

A motorcycle may share a lane only with one other motorcycle. Lane sharing (lane splitting/filtering) with any other vehicle is illegal.

Operators may not transport or carry any object that interferes with their ability to hold the handlebars.

If a motorcycle operator carries a passenger, the motorcycle must have a passenger seat and footrests. Passengers are only permitted to ride on a passenger seat behind the operator or in a side car. Passengers are required to wear DOT-compliant motorcycle helmets.

There are no requirements for passenger age or size in Oregon. However, operators should use good judgment. Passengers should be large enough to reach the footrests, strong enough to hold on securely and mature enough to follow directions and behave predictably.

Oregon's Red Light Law

After coming to a complete stop, if a traffic light controlled by a vehicle sensor fails to detect the motorcycle after waiting one full cycle of the light, the rider may proceed with caution, yielding to other vehicles.

Get Your Endorsement

To ride legally in Oregon, you must have a valid driver license and motorcycle endorsement or instruction permit.

Three-Wheelers, Sidecars and Trikes

"Autocycles" (three-wheeled vehicles with a steering wheel and bucket seat) as defined in ORS 801.133 do not require a motorcycle endorsement. All other types of three-wheelers require a motorcycle endorsement. However, you may apply for a restricted (3W-only) endorsement at DMV. Applicants must pass the DMV motorcycle knowledge test to qualify, but are not required to complete a rider training course or pass a DMV skill test/road test.

Mopeds

All moped operators must:

Have a valid driver license or moped-restricted class C license.

Wear a motorcycle helmet that is DOT-compliant.

Register their moped and display a valid license plate.

Carry liability insurance (25/50/20).

Carry their driver license and current proof of insurance when riding. Not carry passengers.

Mopeds have the same equipment requirements as motorcycles. Moped operators are generally required to follow the same laws as those for motorcycle operators unless noted otherwise.

To be classified and registered as a moped, the vehicle cannot be capable of speeds of more than 30 mph on level ground, and if the power source is a combustion engine, the engine must be 50 cc or less.

Moped operators are not required to have a motorcycle endorsement.

However, moped operators must have a valid class C or higher driver's license.

"Scooter" is an informal term generally used to describe a small motorcycle with a step-through design, usually with an automatic transmission. A scooter can be a motorcycle or a moped, depending on its engine size and speed capability as noted above.
