What does "A.B.A.T.E." mean?


A.B.A.T.E. Stands for A Brotherhood Against Totalitarian Enactments.

We also do business as A Brotherhood Aimed Towards Education.


What is BikePAC?

Team Oregon Motorcycle Safety Program Tip



Ever been stuck at a red light that just won't change?

The Team Oregon mantra "see and be seen" applies to those wire loops embedded in the pavement, too... Cars and trucks are huge masses of metal, easily detected by the sensors.

Motorcycles have way less metallic mass, so you need to choose your lane position. Place your bike so you can be "seen" by putting the bikes engine right over the length of the wire. If you stop in the middle of the loop (or square, or rectangle, or diamond) you might sit there all day.

Special Rules for Motorcycles and Bicycles in Oregon "Dead Red" Law: If a traffic light fails to turn green after going through a full cycle, a motorcyclist or bicyclist can proceed through the intersection with caution. The reason for the special rule is that devices that trigger red lights have difficulty detecting the presence of motorcycles and bicycles.



President Biden has <u>announced</u> that he will direct the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency to issue an emergency waiver to allow for the sale of E15 during the summer months, as well as other actions to facilitate the sale of E15.

The American Motorcyclist Association strongly opposes these moves. The AMA fought a similar waiver under the Trump administration to allow for year-round sales of E15 and even joined a lawsuit led by the American Petroleum Institute, which successfully overturned that proposal.

None of the estimated 22 million motorcycles and ATVs in use in this country is certified by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency to use fuel containing more than 10 percent ethanol by volume. E15, which contains 15 percent ethanol, is in fact illegal to use in motorcycles, boat engines, lawn mowers, chainsaws and other outdoor power equipment products.

The planned EPA waiver is set to be finalized before summertime sales begin on June 1. E15 sales are traditionally barred between June 1 and September 15 due to the blends' higher volatility, which contributes to smog in the warmer months. According to the White House, the EPA will also consider working with states to expand E15 availability and modifying labeling at the fuel pump.

The AMA opposes modifying labels at the pump that could potentially misinform customers. The AMA instead advocates for stronger labeling at the pump to make the potential dangers of E15 clear and concise. The inadequacy of labeling can be seen in the rise of Unleaded 88, a fuel that contains 15 percent ethanol and is deliberately mislabeled.

The AMA is asking motorcyclists nationwide to make their voices heard and send a pre-written message to President Biden and EPA Administrator Michael Regan telling them to reconsider this misguided proposal that will increase the risk of misfuelling for motorcyclists, boaters, and other small engine owners while doing little to address the increased cost of fuel.



Speaking of helmets; I just read a write up from the July 1980 Easyriders magazine. Here is an exert: "Beware of killer helmets"

Britain: The modern full-face helmet, as worn by over a million motorcyclists in Britain, could be a killer. The orthopedic surgeon and chief medical officer for the British Motorcycle Racing Club, Mr. Gordon Hadfield, claims that many modern helmets are "designed to fulfill riders' desires to imitate their race track heroes and not to protect them in accidents."

"These helmets are so heavy that they rotate the rider's head when he falls - causing him to break his neck."

And the bigger the helmet, the worse the rotating effect. At best, the weight tears the helmet off the rider's head on first impact, but in just one Surrey hospital in the last eighteen months seven riders have been admitted dead - killed by their crash helmets.

Investigations revealed that the chin area of their helmets broke as they crashed, jagged pieces of fiberglass stabbed them in the jugular vein or carotid artery, and they bled to death. Just something to think about.

State Membership Report

On May 31st our contest for the Gold ended. S.E. Portland Chapter was the big winner by bringing in 38 new members!! GAS PRICES FUEL MOTORCYCLE **BOOM**

Gasoline prices are soaring to new heights daily, with many consumers considering two wheels instead of four, so as fuel surges past five dollars a gallon, motorcycle sales are skyrocketing.

A typical motorcycle will get you an average of 44 miles per gallon, while an average car gets you around 24 mpg.

That fact is not lost on new bike buyers, as new data from the Motorcycle Industry Council (MIC) shows bike sales are up more than fourteen percent year over year, and many consumers who are switching to two wheels are looking at bigger bikes.

Coinciding with the boom in bike sales, consumers have a strong demand for rider training and education as well. According to the Motorcycle Safety Foundation (MSF), class enrollment increased 48% from 2021 to 2022.

PAIN AT THE PUMP IS MAKING BIKERS RIDE LESS, AND MORE Gas prices have surged to record levels causing what economists and strategists call "demand destruction," where the prices will affect actual consumption. They have already begun to cause a shift AS FUEL COSTS SPIKE, MORE in driving habits.

The average U.S. retail gasoline prices have risen by over 30% since the start of the year, according to data collected by analysts at RBC Capital Markets. As recently reported in Newsweek; "These prices are affecting how Americans spend time on the road, including how they ride their motorcycles."

Motorcycle sales site Cycle Trader recently surveyed 2,209 shoppers on the effect of the high prices. Among the respondents, 35% said that high gas prices have caused them to adjust how they ride.

The Motorcycle Industry Council (MIC) claims that 10 million U.S. households have at least one motorcycle, so that translates to roughly 3.5 million riders feeling the sting at the pump. Among those who have made changes, 34% of riders have decreased how often they ride, cutting down on recreational trips or only going out when necessary. Another 21% said that they have decreased the distances that they ride, while 12% have stopped riding entirely until gas prices go down.

However, many motorcycle riders have adapted their time on the road in different ways, opting to

ride more. Roughly half of those who have made riding adjustments have increased their biking as a fuel-efficient alternative to driving their cars and trucks that require more gas.

PEOPLE RUNNING OUT OF GAS Adding yet another obstacle to avoid on the roadways, AAA reports an increase in roadside assistance calls from motorists stranded with empty fuel tanks. It seems that for lots of folks, the higher gas prices go, the lower the needle on the gas gauge goes, with many drivers running on fumes or even running out of gas.

For the months of April, May and early June, AAA Blue Grass has seen a 60% increase in assistance calls for empty tanks compared to last year's numbers when unleaded gasoline was around \$3 per gallon.

AAA, the nation's largest motor club, told FOX Television Stations that it responded to more than 200,000 out-of-gas calls from January -April, up from 153,668 at the same time last year. In April alone, AAA received 50,787 roadside assistance calls from stranded drivers out of fuel.

The surge of drivers short on cash to fill up their gas tanks has been noted by top executives at gasoline retailers who have reported that drivers are buying less fuel at the pump.

CRIME RISES AS TRAFFIC LAWS **NOT ENFORCED**

Los Angeles and some major cities have stopped enforcing some traffic laws, like broken tail lights or expired stickers, all in the name of racial equity, but critics have said letting people get away with breaking the law will only lead to more crime, and the current crime wave may prove them right.

Back in March, Philadelphia became the first city to ban police officers from pulling over drivers for minor traffic violations like expired tags and broken lenses, but now the Philadelphia FOP (Fraternal Order of Police) is suing to invalidate the new city law, saying it illegally preempts existing state laws on traffic violations.

L.A., Minneapolis and the entire state of Virginia have passed similar prohibitions on low level traffic stops, which they claim disproportionately targets Black drivers.


