

Do you enjoy working on your motorcycle? Do you want to guarantee access to the parts, tools and service information needed to modify, service and maintain your bike? If you answered yes to these questions, it's time to contact your member of the House of Representatives and ask them to cosponsor H.R. 906, the "Right to **Equitable and Professional** Auto Industry Repair Act" or the "REPAIR Act".

The REPAIR Act ensures that vehicle owners or repair shops are not denied access to the information, software or tools needed to work on vehicles. The proposed law also establishes rules


regarding vehicle data access. This commonsense law will help preserve consumer choice and a fair marketplace.


As of July 1st, 32 members of the House of Representatives have signed on in support. That is twice as many as were on the bill before the Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF) held its Bikers Insider the Beltway event in May! The MRF is making a difference, let's keep up the pressure!

Congress returns to Washington D.C. Tuesday, after a two-week break. That makes it the perfect time to contact your lawmaker and tell them you support H.R. 906.



A.B.A.T.E. / BikePac VICTORIES

45 Years of protecting our right to ride!

1977 - Oregon's mandatory helmet law is repealed. ABATE membership CAMPED OUT ON THE CAPITOL STEPS day and night during this time. Legislators overwhelmingly passed the repeal law.

1979 - ABATE of Oregon proposed the state's first rider safety program that was signed into law in 1981 and went on to become the "Team Oregon" training program.

1988 - Helmet choice was again taken away through voter referendum during one of the lowest voter turnouts in Oregon history.

1988 - ABATE members form "BikePac" to have an official presence in the capitol.

1995 - BikePac facilitates the passing of HB 3422 which redefines the Oregon definition of a "motorcycle helmet" and reduces the penalty for not wearing a helmet to a Class D misdemeanor.

1997 - HB 2454 allowing for adult freedom of choice 1997 helmet reform (repeal of mandatory helmets) passes in both the House and the Senate, but is vetoed by then Governor John Kitzhaber.

1997 - Landmark federal court ruling that law enforcement cannot further inquire into whether a rider's helmet meets so-called "federal testing standards" if it meets the Oregon helmet definition.

1999 - REPEAL of the "handlebar height law" in Oregon. Ape hangers are now legal with no restrictions.

2001 - HB 3885 is passed allowing Oregon motorcyclists the right to fuel their own machines.

2001 - 2015: The political climate for riders during this time was tough. However, at EVERY legislative session BikePac introduced helmet freedom of choice legislation. In addition, laws were stifled pertaining to a wide variety of rider rights issues including: motorcycle sound and emissions, rider law enforcement harassment and profiling, legal firearm transportation clarity, ethanol gasoline usage, all terrain vehicle laws, safety and training laws, and much more. Note: In 2015 Governor John Kitzhaber resigned opening improved relations for us in Salem.

2015 - SB 533 the "Dead Red" Light Bill passes! Riders can now proceed cautiously through a red light after 1 complete cycle of the light if one's bike does not trigger the green light.

2017 - HB 2598 "Vehicular Assault Bill" passes! - a "reckless" driver who injures a motorcyclist or their passenger can now be charged with vehicular assault – a Class A Misdemeanor. Driver can be sentenced to up to one year in prison and a maximum fine up to \$6,250. Great thanks to our A.I.M. attorney Christopher Slater!

2019 - SB 810 "Driver Accountability Law" Passes - effective January 1, 2020, adding motorcyclists to the "vulnerable users list." It also requires convicted careless drivers who injure riders to attend driver safety school and perform community service. Great thanks again to our A.I.M. attorney Christopher Slater!

2019 - HB 2314 "Lane Sharing Bill" for the third session in a row did not pass (blocked always in the Transportation Committee.) Great thanks goes to Patrick Leyshock for often taking the lead on this issue as he did an absolutely awesome job. We gained significant traction on this concept in recent years and continue to be confident in passing it!

2021 -- SB 574 "Lane Sharing Bill" would have legalized a limited form of motorcycle lane filtering in Oregon. Bikers and Riders working together got the bill to pass in the Senate and House with great bipartisan majorities. Unfortunately Governor Brown vetoed the bill citing a number of concerns which included the thinking riders would go beyond the law and it would be difficult to enforce. It is too bad because SB 574 was one of the most widely supported bills in that session. Bikers and riders will take another shot at it in 2023.

18 new members joined in June. A total of 17 renewals were received, with 25 hitting the inactive status. Those numbers will change after collecting mail from the PMB at the


Board Meeting. Total member count is 548. With 14 members supporting an additional chapter, we total at

HB2316, expands DUII to include other substances.
It was passed by the Senate in a 24/6 vote and passed along to the Governor. HB2426, expands self-service gas pumping. It also was passed by Senate in a 16/9 vote, with the no votes wanting more protection for those unable to pump their own fuel. It was passed along to Governor and expected to be signed into law. As the legislature whines down, so does the work of Bike Pac. We still need ABATE members to sign up with us, as we can still do good work for motorcyclist in the off season, such as finding out how to pass Lane Sharing, and lining up our supporters in the Legislature.

We are still desperately trying to find an Executive Director for BikePac. If you want to know the duties, ask myself or any of the officer of BikePac about the position. 

If you are traveling this summer, prepare **yourself for the heat**. Heat stroke and heat exhaustion come on fast in very hot weather and can ruin your day, and more. Be sure to hydrate before and during your ride. By the time you feel thirsty, you are already dehydrated. Drink water and sports drinks but avoid coffee, alcohol, and sodas. Snack on salty snacks rather than sugar and chocolate. Stop often and avoid riding during the hottest part of the day. Wear long sleeves and sun protection. A cooling vest works well but only if you wear it under your jacket or vest. Ice cubes in a zippered bag, worn under your jacket can help to keep you cool. If you start to feel lightheaded, dizzy, or get a headache, get off the road asap. Go to a shady spot, or better yet a business with air conditioning to rest and cool off. Don 't let peer pressure ruin your day, or possibly

even your life. Passing out on your bike will do more than delay plans.

ACCIDENT MANAGEMENT You and a few friends are riding, you came around a curve, and there in front of you is a motorcycle accident. What do you do?

- 1. STAY CALM
- Check the ABCs, in this order
 AIRWAY: check to see if the airway is clear. Loosen jacket or shirt if needed. Do not remove helmet.

BREATHING: is the person breathing? Check for pulse. Do you know CPR?

- 3. CIRCULATION: Is the person bleeding? Control the bleeding
- 4. Know where you are: as you ride, pay attention to road signs and mile markers. This will greatly help First Responders to find you
- 5. Secure the scene: use other vehicles to block the area. Your safety comes first!
- 6. Call 911: if you have no cell signal, send someone for help, one person in each direction if possible. Be exact about where you are.
- 7. STAY CALM
- 8. Forget about the bike, do turn it off if it is still running to prevent fire.

What to do BEFORE you get involved in this situation.

- Take a First Aid class
- Become CPR certified
- Carry a good First Aid kit. One that has a tourniquet, large gauze packs (large sanitary napkins work well), and medical tape. In case of an accident, you will need more than Band-Aids.





Endorsement Courses

For new and unlicensed riders, a Team Oregon endorsement course is required by law. Getting your endorsement is done in three steps:

- Take the course
- Pass the test
- Go to DMV

eRider Basic Rider Training is an approved endorsement course all riders. No experience is needed.

Students receive eight hours of on-bike training over 2 days. Training motorcycles are provided. The classroom portion is done online at home. This course meets Oregon's mandatory training requirements for all new license applicants.

Basic Rider Training (BRT) is an approved endorsement course for all riders. No experience is needed.

Students receive eight hours of on-bike training over 2 days. Training motorcycles are provided. Classroom sessions are done in-person, on-site over 3 days. (Note that face masks may be required in the classroom.) This course meets Oregon's mandatory training requirements for all new license applicants.

eRider Intermediate Rider Training_is an approved endorsement course for riders 21 and older who can already operate a motorcycle. You must be able to smoothly get underway, turn, shift and stop. Students receive four hours of on-bike training. Training motorcycles are provided. The classroom portion is done online at home. This course meets Oregon's mandatory training requirements for new license applicants 21 and older.

<u>Intermediate Rider Training (IRT)</u> is an approved endorsement course for riders 21 and older who can already operate a motorcycle. You must be able to smoothly get underway, turn, shift and stop.

Students receive four hours of on-bike training. Training motorcycles are provided. The classroom portion is done inperson, on-site. (Note that face masks may be required in the classroom.) This course meets Oregon's mandatory training requirements for new license applicants 21 and older.

Advanced Training

For endorsed riders, the Team Oregon suite of advanced courses will help you tune up, smooth over, sort out, dial in and nail down your riding skills. Join us!

For endorsement courses for new, returning and unlicensed riders, click here.

RSP Road Riding Tactics (RSP) is for endorsed riders who want to raise their skills to a higher level, focusing on low-speed control, effective braking and precision curve skills. Tuition is \$99. 4.5 hours

Advanced Braking Clinic (ABC) is a short course for endorsed riders to refine braking skills in normal and emergency situations at real road speeds. Learn to use that ABS! Tuition is \$79. 3 hours

Cornering Clinic is taught on a kart track and focused on curve skills. Learn where to look, body position, selecting lines and linking turns. Trikes and reverse trikes welcome! Tuition is \$79. 2.5 hours

Precision Maneuvering Clinic (PMC) is a slow-cone course for endorsed riders modeled on police motorcycle training. Participants master low-speed balance and control, tight turns, U-turns, group riding and parking techniques. Tuition is \$99. 4.5 hours

BikePAC of Oregon 2023 Bills to watch

HB2426 AND THE
POTENTIAL AMENDMENT
Authorizes self-service
dispensing of Class 1
flammable liquids at retail
dispensary.

HB 2707

Requires sentencing court to order person convicted of drunk driving offense that resulted in death of victim to pay restitution to surviving child of victim in form of child maintenance.

HB 2316

Expands offense of driving while under influence of intoxicants to include any substance that, when taken into human body, can impair the ability of person to operate vehicle safely.

BikePac of Oregon is an allvolunteer political action committee funded entirely through annual memberships and donations from A.B.A.T.E. of Oregon and other concerned individuals and groups. We do not hold poker runs, fund raisers, and so-forth to raise money. During legislative sessions we have one or more members lobbying in person for your rights as a rider at the Oregon State Capitol while the legislature is present in Salem. Our only public event is held the first Saturday in May each year on the Capitol steps.

HB2316, expands DUII to include other substances. It was passed by the Senate in a 24/6 vote and passed along to the Governor. HB2426, expands self-service gas pumping. It also was passed by Senate in a 16/9 vote, with the no votes wanting more protection for those unable to pump their own fuel. It was passed along to Governor and expected to be signed into law. As the legislature whines down, so does the work of Bike Pac. We still need ABATE members to sign up with us, as we can still do good work for motorcyclist in the off season, such as finding out how to pass Lane Sharing, lining up our supporters in Legislature.

When I came into BikePAC efforts were made to keep us silent during GAC meetings. But something has changed, and we are now being asked to participate in decision making and join in partnerships with ODOT and Team Oregon. There's even a partnership with OSP brewing, that I'm excited to be a part of. I'm not ready to step down nor give up on BikePAC.

Jeff Greiner from ODOT has incentivized the GAC to be more involved with ABATE, and Bob Thomas has been a god sent for ABATE during those meetings.

I appreciate your and Larry's work for Oregon's riders. And extend my gratitude to our fearless secretary, Deb.

The new chair of the Governor's advisory committee on motorcycle safety (GAC MS), Don Hammon, stated in the GAC meeting last night (7/19) how good it was to see the impeccable way Oregon's riders strategically coordinated across the state, and in ways the legislature has never seen before. He said "It was quite impressive"!

ODOT highlighted the bills they were tracking and asked us to highlight SB422, which was accommodating to BikePAC's attendance at the GAC. They don't have to do that, and never have before (asked us to speak about anything while board members give reports). In fact, we were reminded we would have our turn at the end. Duties of the Executive Director are to preside over BikePAC meetings, set priorities of legislative action, provide budget input to the Treasurer and generally provide oversight to activities.


