Hardly-David's-Son Switches To All-Electric Line-up

H.D.S. has announced that it's just plain tired of fighting environmentalists over maintaining infernal combustion engines on their motorcycles, so they're converting all new bikes to electric power.

"W...we got a really good deal on electric motors from a toy manufacturer that was changing to glow-plug engines," stammered Imma Naughtreal, H.D.S. night janitor and company spokesperson. "The d...down side is that it

takes a lot of D-cells wired up in series/parallel to power our bikes now. T...to offset the increased weight, all our motorcycle frames are now filled with helium to make the bikes lighter."

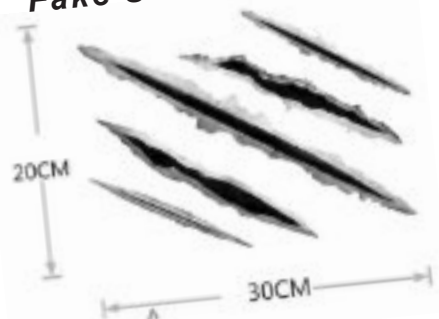
The company is moving to offer a rechargeable D-cell option coupled with bicycle-style wheel generator so batteries can be charged while riding, especially going downhill or with a tailwind.

Standard equipment includes

built-in frame clips to hold playing cards on the spokes, a thumb-operated bell, and pink plastic grip tassels.

Naughtreal noted that gearing had to be changed radically for the 3-volt electric DC motors. *"Sh...sure, people can walk faster than the bikes now, but we're committed to flogging a great tradition to death in the name of progress."*

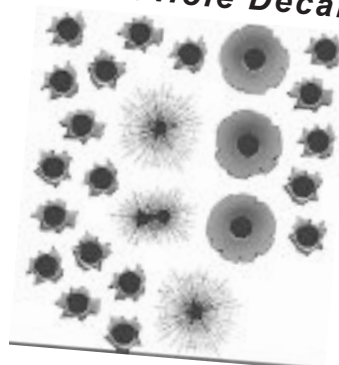

Frequently Asked Questions

What is A.B.A.T.E.?

We are a State Motorcycle Rights Organization (S.M.R.O.) dedicated to educating riders, drivers, and elected officials about issues affecting motorcyclists.

We help fund a political action committee (*BikePAC*) that directly interacts with the legislature about motorcycles issues and bills that affect us.

What does "A.B.A.T.E." mean?

A.B.A.T.E. stands for *A Brotherhood Against Totalitarian Enactments*. The organization was formed when legislators passed bills adversely affecting riders without consulting them.

We also do business as *A Brotherhood Aimed Towards Education*.

Mission Statement

A.B.A.T.E. of Oregon, Inc. Promotes motorcycle awareness, education, safety, and liberty through community involvement and legislative action.

What is BikePAC?

Founded in 1988, *BikePAC* members track legislation, brief officials, and report to A.B.A.T.E. about issues affecting motorcyclists.

A.B.A.T.E. and BikePAC Legislative Victories

1977 – Oregon helmet requirement repealed.

1979 – Rider safety program proposed by A.B.A.T.E.

1981 – *Team Oregon* rider safety legislation passed.

1988 – Voter referendum reinstates helmet requirement.

" *BikePAC* formed for motorcyclists' legislative efforts.

1995 – Motorcycle helmet definition standardized. (HB– 3422)

1997 – Adult helmet freedom of choice bill passed, vetoed by governor.

1997 – Federal court equates federal testing standards with Oregon helmet definition.

1999 – Motorcycle handlebar height regulation repealed.

2001 – Riders given choice to fuel bikes at service stations. (HB-3885)

2001– 2013 Hostile capitol environment to motorcycle legislative efforts.

2015 – "*Dead Red*" bill passes. (SB-533)
Riders allowed to proceed if light not triggered after one cycle.

2017 – Reckless drivers held accountable for motor-cyclist harm. (HB-2598)

2019 – Drivers can be held criminally negligent for motorcyclist injuries. (SB– 810)

2019 Lane sharing bill didn't pass.
| Lane sharing bill vetoed by governor.

2023 Lane sharing bill died in house transportation committee.

Legislators didn't give motorcyclists these victories.

We had to work hard together to gain or regain our rights.

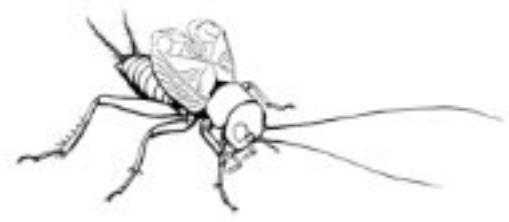

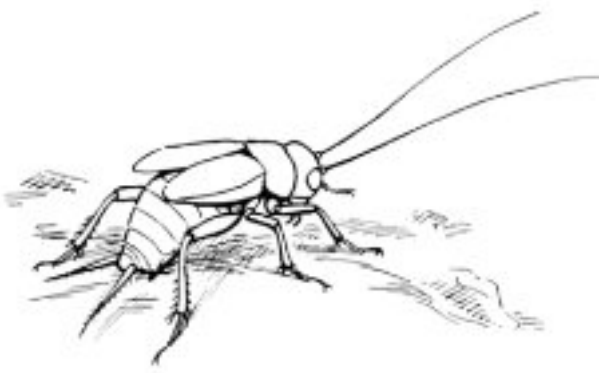

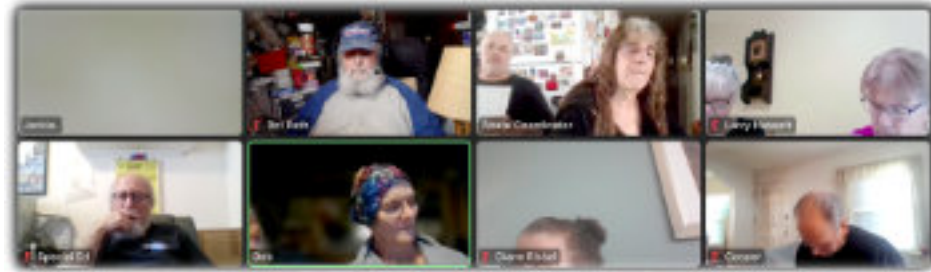

Relating to veterans' recognition plates.

The Act says that owners of motorcycles and mopeds may also get veterans' plates if the owner qualifies. (Flesch Readability Score: 66.4).

Authorizes the Department of Transportation to issue qualifying owners veterans' recognition registration plates for use on mopeds and motorcycles.

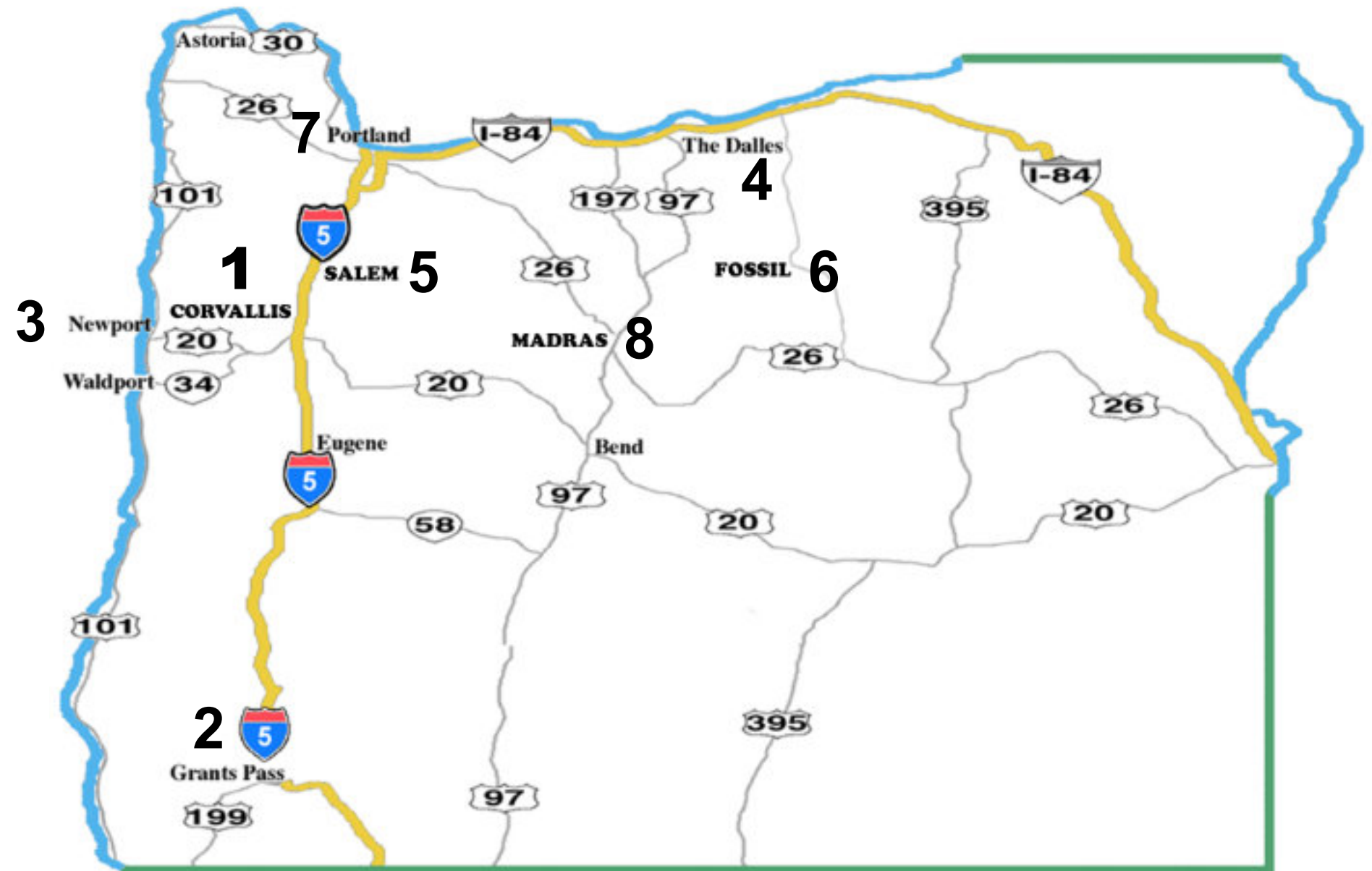

She has a lot of self-doubts, but figures out how to keep moving forward despite them. (Like a motorcycle with no reverse gear.)

If you don't want to spend any money on a book you're not sure about, *Bloody Jack* and the following novels in the series are available at public libraries, in print or as audio books. Most book stores (new or used) carry it or it can be ordered on-line if you find yourself captivated by Jacky's adventures. (alibris.com is a good

source of new or used printed materials and is what book stores use.)

IT IS HEREBY ADJUDGED AND DECLARED that Oregon House Bill 3422 means that as long as a motorcycle rider is wearing a protective covering on his head that has a hard outer shell, padding adjacent to and inside the outer shell and a chin-strap retention system with a sticker indicating that the motorcycle helmet meets standards established by the United States Department of Transportation the rider is in compliance with state law with respect to his helmet and a police officer may not inquire further to determine if the helmet worn meets United States Department of Transportation testing standards.

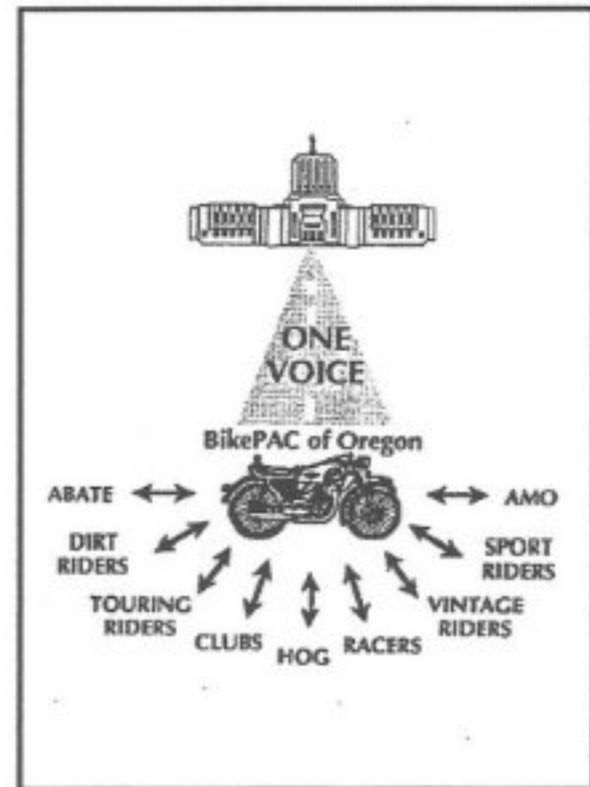
