Oregon Lane Splitting Bill Dies In Committee . . . Again !

According to a letter from Oregon senator Mark Meek, HB–3542 (lane splitting) will not be passed out of the house transportation committee during the current legislative session and is therefore considered to be dead.

During a public hearing held 07 April, testimony from 84 people was received supporting the measure while four opposed it and two were neutral.

Among those opposing lane-splitting was the *Oregon/Idaho American Automobile Association*, a reserve deputy, and a Portland administrator.

What's going on here? How can elected public officials fail to act on legislation that has so much public support?

If the desires of a few outweigh the will of a majority, then there is something wrong with the system.

Every proposed bill should be allowed to wind its way through the legislative process, not be pigeon-holed to die in committee because someone in a position of power doesn't like it. (Or won't benefit from it.)

How is it that bicyclists were able to get legislation passed that allows them to roll through stop signs in the interest of safety, yet motorcyclists face opposition when lane-splitting would make riding in heavy traffic safer for the biker?

We need to contact our elected representatives and hold them accountable for their actions. (Or inactions.)

In the next full Oregon legislature, perhaps we need to have a bill introduced that would also allow two-wheel motorcyclists to treat stop signs as yield signs. While a brouhaha is going on over that, lane splitting and helmet choice might be able to slide by unnoticed and be enacted.

Stop Means Stop . . Sometimes

Like most kids of the 1950s, yer crusty ol' editor grew up with single speed backpedal-braked bicycles, riding and repairing them.

When coming up to a stop sign, we'd position the left pedal slightly forward as we braked to a stop and put our right foot on the curb. (If any.) It was easy to get moving again because we could put our weaight on the pre-positioned left pedal. Our legs were stronger because we had to come to a complete halt, then start up again.

For the last five years, Oregon's revised statutes (ORS) have singled out bicycle users to treat stop signs as yield signs in the name of efficiency.

The claim is that it takes more effort for human-powered vehicles to start up from a complete stop than if the bicycle is kept rolling.

Huh?

That's true of *any* vehicle, no matter *how* it's powered.

Today's bicycles tend to be multigeared with hand brakes. They can be shifted into a lower gear before stopping so it's much easier to get going again than it was with earlier single-speed bikes.

The claim of increased efficiency is a very thin motivation for allowing *only* bicyclists to ignore stop signs.

Imagine how much energy would be saved annually if all stop signs and flashing red traffic lights were replaced by yield signs. (And imagine the chaos as many road-users abuse the situation.)

While Oregon motorcyclists have been

trying for years to have lane-splitting legalized in the name of safety and traffic flow efficiency, how is it that Oregon bicyclists have succeeded in evading road user responsibility just because they don't want to come to a complete stop? Why are they given special privlages on Oregon roadways paid for by taxes on fuel, personal income, or property?

Personally, yer crusty ol' editor thinks that the Oregon revised statute that allows bicyclists to treat stop signs as a yield sign should be repealed.

"Stop" is supposed to mean "Stop" for *everyone*.

If most people are riding bicycles for exercise, then starting up from a full stop is going to be more beneficial to their well being than rolling past stop signs.


Yer c.o.e. suspects that the *real* reason behind this keep-rolling regulation is for the benefit of those riders who choose to use toe clips on their pedals along with special shoes to gain additional power by pulling as well as pushing their pedals. It can be difficult to disengage their shoe from the pedal when coming to a full halt.

The thing is, they *choose* to ride with that configuration. That doesn't mean they get to change the rules of the road to suit their needs.

Meanwhile, Oregon motorcycle riders need to go back and figure out how bicycists managed to get such a change to traffic regulations onto the books. Maybe we can adapt and use some of their tactics.

Legal or Law just can't see it

In the course of life, people often develop their own definitions of words or concepts based on their experiences.

Most folks see no difference between the words "law" and "rules".

Yer crusty ol' editor sees a definite distinction based on reading and his life own observations.

Government and the legal profession claim that rules. regulations, and statutes are laws.

They are not.

True laws are universal and immediately self-enforcing.

Rules, regulations, and statutes are specific to situations and require voluntary compliance or external enforcement.

An example:

Legally a pedestrian who marches into a crosswalk has rightof-way.

An approaching vehicle that is unable to stop is operating under the law of gross tonnage. (A variation of Newton's laws of motion.)



Which system is going to prevail in the preceding situation – legal or law?

The truth is that those in positions of power (government) often try to present the rules that they use to regulate human

behavior as laws, so as to sanctify such statutes into unquestioned and accepted limits on our activities.

What we, the true people, need to do is realize that such so-called "laws" are really nothing more than guidelines that allow us to function together in society. (While keeping in mind that government has granted itself tremendous authority and power to enforce its rules through its legal system.)



And another thing . . .

Illegal window tinting increases risks for police safety motorcyclists.

It used to be that a rider could count on being able to see through the windows of cages to see traffic activity that could adversely affect their riding.

Now many vehicles have heavilytinted windows that make seeing beyond them difficult or downright impossible.



Oregon regulations require that front side windows in all vehicles allow 35% light transmission while rear and back windows may be completely blacked out in SUVs and vans.

Trouble is, too many people are their front windows having completely blacked out as well, which certified window tinting companies are *not* supposed to do.

Why are regulation enforcers not going after cage drivers with illegally tinted windows? They would be doing the rest of us a favor by helping make the roadways just a little bit safer.

Unless legislation is passed doing away with window-tinting (unlikely),




