A.B.A.T.E. and BikePAC Legislative Victories

- **1977** Oregon helmet requirement repealed.
- **1979** Rider safety program proposed by A.B.A.T.E.
- **1981** *Team Oregon* rider safety legislation
- **1988** Voter referendum reinstates helmet requirement.
 - BikePAC formed for motorcyclists' legislative efforts.
- **1995** Motorcycle helmet definition standardized. (HB– 3422)
- **1997** Adult helmet freedom of choice bill passed, vetoed by governor.
- 1997 Federal court equates federal testing standards with Oregon helmet definition.
- 1999 Motorcycle handlebar height regulation repealed.

- **2001** Riders given choice to fuel bikes at service stations. (HB-3885)
- **2001–2013** Hostile capitol environment to motorcycle legislative efforts.
- **2015** "*Dead Red*" bill passes. (SB-533) Riders allowed to proceed if light not triggered after one cycle.
- **2017** Reckless drivers held accountable for motor-cyclist harm. (HB-2598)
- 2019 Drivers can be held criminally negligent for motorcycist injuries. (SB–810)
- 2019 Lane sharing bill didn't pass. Lane sharing bill vetoed by governor.
- 2023 Lane sharing bill died in house transportation committee.

Considering how well-organized and successful these volunteer-run science fiction conventions are, what are some of their features that we could adapt to our own motorcycle events?

- Guest of Honor Ideally a person of national or local fame. ideally who rides motorcycles. Could be used as a way to get local support by having city councilors, mayors, or county commissioners as guests.
- **Professionals** Get folks from national motorcycle rights groups to speak and socialize. Have people

who work on motorcycles or riding gear give demonstrations and talks about their craft.

- Exhibits In addition to bike shows and vendors, have motorcycle-themed art and craft shows. (Adult and youth.)
- Kick Back Place Perhaps a large sideless tent with sturdy chairs at outdoor events where folks can sit down to relax and chat or take refuge from the elements.
- Dead Bike Party Reward for those who help clean up after an event.

Yer crusty ol' editor urges you to visit a science fiction convention, not only as a fun event but also with an eye towards seeing how they do things, how they make the experience so much fun that folks keep flocking back year-after-year.




